Pyrford Church of England Primary School

13 October 2017

Good morning. I thought I had better try and get ahead of myself today by writing this well before school has started for the day as we are shortly due to receive a coach load of visitors from France who will be touring the building. To say I am a little nervous would be an understatement and I am desperately hoping that their English is considerably stronger than my GCSE French.

This week has been taken up with many a meeting. Mrs Little, Mrs Alexander and myself met with the Education Welfare Officer (EWO) from Surrey this week. The purpose of the visit is to monitor attendance and punctuality at school. We discuss individual cases, any pupils with broken weeks, late arrivals at school and other absences and the EWO checks the procedures the school has in place to ensure that we are chasing absences and lates. I was really pleased to receive the news that the school continues to have outstanding attendance at 97.1% in 2016/17 so a huge thank you to parents for supporting our drive to keep attendance at school a priority. I think figures may have taken a nose dive this week though with a nasty virus sweeping through Reception classes. Hopefully those of you who have fallen victim to this are now on the mend.

The highlight of our week at school has been the visit by Bishop Jo Bailey Wells along with Alex Tear and Mike Hall from the Diocesan Education office. Bishop Jo led a fantastic collective worship session on our theme this week which is 'The bread of life.' Bishop Jo was particularly impressed with the children's singing and the fantastic prayers which the children had written themselves. Reverend Aiken and myself did smile though when Bishop Jo confided to us that she was extremely nervous of delivering collective worship to 480 eager children. The children very ably demonstrated what a strong community we have here at Pyrford.

We were also visited this week by an external educational consultant who knows the school well. It is important that we continually quality assure the work that we do at school. His visit focussed on how we stretch the most able children. We visited classes, spoke to children and had a good look through the books. There were some stunning pieces of work which neither of us could believe had been written by children. Work we looked at, particularly in Year 6, easily matched that of year 9 pupils. I hope parents feel proud of their children and that you can appreciate the level of work that your children are producing across the school when you come to the upcoming parents meetings.

Many thanks to those of you who have already responded to our parent questionnaire. We have had a good return but if you haven't had time yet please can I encourage you to log on and share your views. The leadership team and governing body are keen to know what we can do to improve our educational offer at the school and how we communicate that most effectively to you.

Next week is our last week before the half term holiday. Year 5 are visiting the Planetarium, but the highlight of my week is going to be the half termly tea party. I love this aspect of my job the most and this gives me the opportunity to really get to know every single pupil in the school. In fact Bishop Jo and her colleagues commented on my ability to name all the children which for me is so important. The week will culminate with a sports themed mufti day organised by the PTA, I may have to give this one some thought!

Have a wonderful weekend, the current forecast is for warm autumn sunshine.
