It is also Children in Need day and whilst we aren't directly raising money for the charity, we are acknowledging the day by talking about it with the children and the kitchen are making Pudsey Bear biscuits for lunch.

Another thanks to parents who warmly supported the book sale we held this week. We sold just over $\pounds 1600$ of books which in turn gives the school over $\pounds 1000$ to spend on books for the children. This type of event really helps to boost our resources.

The author Kerry Gibb visited the school this week and had a captivated audience. The children loved her visit and were mesmerised when she was reading from her book and describing characters. The children also asked some fantastic questions.

Following the display in church last weekend of the Remembrance mosaics, we have been contacted with an offer to display them in the Lightbox Gallery in Woking. The children were thrilled to hear that their work had been so well appreciated and even more excited at the prospect of it possibly being put on display in the future for more people to see. Year 5 are culminating all the work they have been doing about World War I with a visit to the Imperial War Museum in London next week.

We have lots of experiential learning activities taking place next week, including an able writers author day as well as a Roman and Celts day for Year 3. Reception classes have also been enjoying their Igloo role play area - it has been the highlight of their week! Please see the pics of it overleaf.

This week has been Anti-bullying Week and we have spent a lot of time talking to children about what this means and who we should talk to. Hopefully the children are all fully aware of our job to keep them safe in school and that we are always here to support them and listen to them. I was impressed with their understanding of the school and its support systems when I led assembly on Monday.

We held prospective parents talks and tours this week with over 100 people visiting. The House Captains in school did a fantastic job of showing visitors around the school and explaining everything that happens here. The children spoke about the school with such pride and many of the visitors made a point of telling me how impressed they were with the children.


Cherry - Momna Najaf for a diary entry which conveyed emotion and contained accurate complex sentences.

CONSULTATION ON THE SCHOOL'S ADMISSIONS ARRANGEMENTS FOR 2019/20

The governors are consulting as they propose making changes to the arrangements, mainly relating to church attendance (criteria 6 & 8).

To increase the school's inclusivity they wish to widen the definition of church from 'Anglican' to 'Christian', defined as being any church which is a member of Churches Together in Britain and Ireland. At the same time, the requirement to be a member of a church electoral roll would be removed, as the 12 months' attendance required in relation to school admission is longer than that required to join the church electoral roll.

In order to ensure greater accuracy in the worship attendance records and in the interests of fairness and clarity for parents, governors wish to introduce a Supplementary Information Form which requires a parent(s) to have their form signed by the minister/churchwarden twice each month of the relevant 12 month period, to prove their church attendance. This will give parents control over the monitoring of their attendance at church and enable them to demonstrate that they have met the requirements of the school's admissions policy.

Governors also wish to remove Tots Praise from the list of services deemed to constitute worship within the Ecclesiastical Parish of Wisley with Pyrford. Tots Praise is essentially a social gathering for young children, whereas the school's admissions policy is concerned with the attendance of parents at church for the purpose of worship. After consultation with the church, the active worship element of Tots Praise was not considered of sufficient substance and governors believe that 4 O'clock Church is now a valid service for those unable to attend church on a Sunday morning.

Additional maps have also been added to the Admissions Policy for the purposes of clarity, together with reference to the Parish Finder section of the Church of England website 'A Church Near You' in relation to determining parish boundaries, http://www.achurchnearyou.com/parishmap.php


