You can't have failed to see that the long awaited play equipment has finally been installed. It is due to be completed ready for use next week. Workmen having been working 7-7 every day this week to ensure that it is completed as quickly as possible. This play area is for our KS2 pupils to use. There is a separate play area and equipment for EYFS and KS1 pupils at the Peatmore end of the school which, in time, we would also like to add to.

This week the new Diocesan Education Director, Alex Tear, visited the school to meet with myself and the Chair of governors and Incumbent. It was a good opportunity to discuss where Pyrford is as a school and what we have to offer the school led system as well as what lies ahead in the strategic landscape for church schools nationally. Alex is due to return to the school to meet with staff and pupils. Bishop Jo Bailey Wells, the Suffragan Bishop of Dorking is also visiting the school next month to meet with staff and pupils.

I am really pleased to announce that Mrs McAllister has successfully managed to gain a grant for the school through the Lottery fund. Mrs McAllister, our school business manager, put together a bid for 'Perfect Playtimes' and as such the funds can be put to good use to support all the fantastic work that the PTA have already achieved and to provide some much needed storage space for all the outdoor equipment we have for learning.

Whilst I am on the subject of playgrounds, please can I remind you all to put bikes and scooters in the appropriate storage spaces at the Coldharbour and Peatmore ends of the school. This also includes bikes and scooters of younger siblings. I have had a number of complaints from parents about younger siblings whizzing across the playground at drop off times. Bikes and scooters may be walked across the school site but not ridden.


Who are Woking Schools Football Association?

Dear Kathryn,

I would like to thank you, your team, children, and parent on behalf of all of the members of Friends of Chernobyl's Children Woking (Children/host families/helpers/friends) for your fantastic generosity yet again.

The use of your pool is a huge bonus - although next year we must focus on learning to swim rather than just fun! Although I didn't come along to the lunches you provided for our children they always returned to the afternoon sessions very happy with the delicious food. The money you raised for the 'Blues for Shoes' helped us to allow a budget of £40 for each child to have a pair of school shoes and trainers. It is always very exciting to go shoe shopping with the children - rarely do they have new shoes in Belarus. I know that once they have outgrown the shoes they are either passed to siblings or with in the wider community.

As you know, our children are from the most impoverished families in the Chernobyl area of Belarus, living in the contaminated zone. Not only do the visits help the children improve and build their immune systems to fight the illness caused by radiation and poverty, but also their emotional well being. Many of our children come from families where alcoholism is rife together with domestic violence. They often end up as carers to adults or younger siblings. When they come to the UK they have a month of being a child, to run, laugh, play - just as our own children. This has an enormous impact combined with the month of clean (non radiated) food, love and support from local host families, vitamins and health checks. This year both our GP and Dentist (Lorna Done in Woking) have noticed an improvement in dental and overall health. The parents in Belarus and teachers comment on improved attention/concentration/general behaviour once the children have returned home.

Our children had a fantastic time in England this year - the weather was very kind to us, all our activities have worked to plan (!). You and your team at Pyrford are a significant contributor to our continued successful visits.

I look forward to working with you again. It has been an absolute pleasure.


