Good morning.

It's a beautiful sunny morning today and hopefully this will continue through the weekend. The choir are off to the singing picnic in Woking Park today, so it couldn't be a better day for it. As I type, I can hear the children singing in the hall, it sounds super. I was also lucky enough to accompany the children who were singing at Princes Hall theatre in Aldershot on Monday evening. That too was a great event where our children joined others from Surrey schools to perform some songs to live music, all organised by Surrey Arts. A big thank you to Mrs Gill and Mrs Reynell who freely give up their time to teach and rehearse the children so that we can give them these opportunities.

I've recently received some fantastic feedback from various places. The cycling proficiency team from Surrey made a real effort to give feedback about how polite, respectful and generally well behaved our year 6 pupils were and St George's College's leadership team contacted me to feedback how engaging and polite our year 5 and 6 pupils had been who worked there over the last week.

Last Friday the school was externally moderated - on this occasion for the standard of writing produced by our Year 6 pupils. This is in line with a national programme of moderation. The purpose is to check that the school is accurately assessing pupils' work and bench marking nationally. The visit was a great success and the school was praised for the high quality writing which had been produced by pupils (pupils' books are chosen at random on the day by external moderators). The school was praised for the excellent opportunities for children to write regularly at length across a range of purposes, the consistency across classes and the excellent internal and external moderation opportunities with which the staff engage.

The range of trips and visits continues into next week, following Year 2's visit to the Look Out Discovery Centre and Year 4's visit to Wisley this week. Year 6 are heading out for the week to Gaveston Hall for their residential visit, which I am sure will be fantastic and we have the Forest School running for Years I and 3. Year I are also going to Chessington Zoo, so a great week for them!

Our sports diary is also full next week, following the great cricket we've been engaging with this week. Please see the full report later in the newsletter. Next week District Sports are taking place and Mrs Cockle has been working relentlessly with classes on their athletic techniques and trials in readiness for next week.

We are fast approaching one of our popular social events - the Masked Ball - where there are a number of items for auction. For those of you not able to attend the event, we will be holding a stall in the rear playground on Thursday 21st June - please stop by to see what goodies are on offer in the silent auction. All the monies raised will go directly to the children, providing some of the great opportunities and equipment we are privileged to have in this school.

On Monday evening 35 children from our choir joined 5 other schools to perform Go Lightening Vikings on stage at the Princes Hall. They sang brilliantly and were a credit to the school.



On Tuesday 12th June Year 2 visited The Look Out Discovery Centre in Bracknell. The children had a fantastic time exploring the hands on Science area and bug hunting. They also learnt about food chains and the parts of an insect. They enjoyed a woodland walk and had fun in the play area. They were extremely well behaved and we were so proud of them that we've awarded both classes the Golden Book certificate for this week.



Yesterday, Year 6 had an exciting afternoon full of Science experiments. These included: creating a 'Gene Tree', making DNA out of sweets, counting taste buds on their tongues and blowing a variety of shaped bubbles such as squares and triangles!!







We have had an extremely busy week on the sporting front. Trials for District Sports have taken place and teams have been selected. This year the event is different from previous years in that every child selected has to sprint, run a middle distance race, do a standing jump and throw a vortex. We can only take 5 girls and 5 boys from years 3/4 and the same for years 5/6. With all the athletic talent we have in the school it has been a very hard job selecting such a small team.

During the school day the children have been having lessons in rounders and athletics. They have all enjoyed our new track that runs round the playing fields. It has been wonderful to see even the Year 1 children being able to race around 300m.

We have played a number of important cricket matches this week. On Monday, our team of year 6 boys played in the quarter finals of the Geoff Richard's Trophy. We had been the only state primary school to get through to that round. We went to Cranmore to play their team. Our boys played valiantly against a very strong Cranmore team (who comprised of Surrey and Hampshire County players). We lost the match but it was a very exciting game. Our boys were complimented by the Master of Cricket at Cranmore on their high standard of cricket and sportsmanship. Well done to Sami (Captain), Charlie, Jack H, Tom G, Jack P, Tom B, George and Andrew.

The Cranmore match served as a great warm up for Tuesday's all day tournament at Pyrford CC. This was another hard ball tournament - The Connellan Trophy. We played Pirbright, Brookwood, West Byfleet and Horsell during the course of the day. We won every match, which meant we won the tournament. The boys' fielding was strong (we had learned a few new tactics during the Cranmore game) and their batting was incredible. We scored a large amount of 4's and some amazing 6's. It was a very exciting tournament to watch. As a result of this win, we now have a place in the County Finals which are due to be played at St. George's College next month. Some brilliant cricket played by Charlie (Captain), Jack H, Tom G, Tom B, Andrew, Sami and George. The boys are going from strength to strength.



On Wednesday we played in the Year 5 Kwik Cricket tournament at Old Woking CC. Our team consisted of George (Captain), Will, Sam, Nate, Billy, Lola, Charlotte and Sophie. We won all three of our pool matches against New Haw, Broadmere and St. Johns. We then proceeded to the semi finals where we played West Byfleet. This was a close game but unfortunately we lost. We then played our final game, which was a final for 3rd/4th place and we managed to win our match placing us in 3rd place in the District. Well done to all the children who played, they did an amazing job.

Thank you to the parents who came along to support us through all the highs and occasional lows of our cricketing journey. Thank you also to those who helped transport the children. Your help and support is very much appreciated. A special mention to Mr Don Lawson (Charlie's Grandad) who has been such an amazing coach to our Year 6 cricket squad, helping me run the cricket nets every Monday, as well as coaching and supporting the boys during the matches and tournaments.

Next week we look forward to year 3/4 District Sports on Monday and year 5/6 District Sports on Thursday. There will be a full report in next week's newsletter.

Cyberbullying conversation starters: Talking to 6-10 years olds

Before you start the conversation



Think about when and where best to talk to them - in the car or a neutral place where they feel safe



Jot down what you want to say to focus your mind, and make the conversation relevant to them



Be open and encouraging to make them feel supported



Have a few bite sized conversations to give them time to process

What you need to know



Think carefully about allowing your child on social media as the minimum age on most networks is 13 years old



Cyberbullying can take place 24/7 and happens repeatedly on a range of apps, games and devices



Younger children can confuse any nasty comment or opinion as 'bullying' so their understanding of bullying can be different to that of adults



Bullying is a learnt behaviour - so it's important to set a good example and regularly reinforce being a good digital citizen

Tips to prevent cyberbullying



Be engaged

Talk to your child about
what they like to do
online and what they
know about how to
stay safe



Be kind online Being positive and respectful online is key to using the internet safely.



Know how to report Make sure your child knows how to report cyberbullying if it happens to them or someone else

Tips to deal with cyberbullying



Make sure your child knows they can share anything that upsets them online with a trusted adult. Watch Childnet's Captain Kara video 'T for Tell'



Never retaliate - remind your child that saying mean things back to a bully makes the situation worse



Save the evidence – encourage your child to save messages, photos and screenshots of online bullying as proof to show to a trusted adult



Explore the games and apps your child uses together and find report and block buttons to understand what they do

Actions you can take to support them



Listen and help Allow your child to explain what has happened and talk about it before making judgements



Don't deny access
It can be tempting to
ban devices or using the
internet to prevent the
bullying but this isn't a
solution and can make a
child feel worse



Know how to get help
Your child's school can
help you deal with
cyberbullying and
provide support and
advice. If you feel the law
has been broken then
online bullying can also
be reported to your local
police force

Tips to prevent cyberbullying



Set parental controls on devices your child can access



Talk to your child about what it means to have friends and followers online. Are they real friends? Can they trust them?



Be aware that your child might start exploring romantic relationships. Talk about what they can safely share and who to trust



Encourage your child to be kind to others and think about the impact of words and actions



Set parental controls on devices your child can



Talk to your child about what it means to have friends and followers online. Are they real friends? Can they trust them?



Be aware that your child might start exploring romantic relationships. Talk about what they can safely share and who to trust



Encourage your child to be kind to others and think about the impact of words and actions

Tips to deal with cyberbullying



Don't jump to conclusions. Gently explore with your child what has gone on before the message or the post



Be aware the cyberbullying can be a continuation of, or a response to bullying already happening at school or elsewhere



Don't encourage your child to retaliate in any way that is angry, offensive or threatening



Be aware that all forms of bullying can make you feel very sad, afraid and alone. Reassure your child that together you will sort it out



Think carefully before taking away your child's access to their phone or tablet (this can increase loneliness)



Help your child to report any offensive content to the social media provider



Encourage your child to broaden their network of friends and to take part in activities that make them feel good about themselves



Seek help. You could talk to your child's school or if your child feels harassed or threatened, the police. There are also charities like Kidscape that can give advice


