Good morning and a very warm welcome back to school and to what is our first newsletter of the year.

We have now completed our first full week in school and we are wondering what happened to the holidays?

As always we have hit the ground running with lots going on in school and I know some classes have already received information about trips and visits, as well as an email about meeting the teacher to hear what is happening in your child's year group this year. Those dates are all in the newsletter for you to check and we will be adding dates to the newsletter weekly, so please keep a close eye out for what is going on. Also in response to questionnaires, teachers in Reception will be present at our first Welcome Wednesday of the year so that they can give you a heads up on how your child is settling in socially to school. We will of course be holding individual parent meetings shortly after half term for all pupils.

During the summer the school didn't stand still. We had various works and meetings going on for the duration of the holidays. In response to last years questionnaire, we have saved up and had the area outside Year I tarmacked. It is now more accessible for parents and children and, primarily, it provides a really good space for outdoor learning for Year I. Continue to watch that space as we resource it with exciting learning opportunities.

We have been keeping a close eye on the field over the summer months and met with the maintenance team. Significant damage was caused last year due to the hot weather conditions and the heavy usage (the field is used a lot by external users out of school hours). I'm pleased to say that we have managed to gain half of the field back for PE lessons, but the top half nearest the school is still out of action whilst repairs and reseeding takes place. Sports clubs are able to use the piece of field which is in better condition, but grounds maintenance have requested that no football studs be worn until further notice. I will keep you posted on the condition of the ground and as and when we are able to run a sports day, which I am told is is not looking likely this term.

You will have received an email this week informing you that we are unable to take adhoc bookings in Treetops after school club at the moment. This is also the case for Breakfast Club. Demand for both is huge and we are very keen to meet that need. On most days there are over 75 pupils attending. We are keen to retain quality and as with any business, we need to be able to plan safe staffing levels as well as ordering enough meals.

Please can I remind everyone that the school gates open at 8.30am, doors open at 8.40am and all gates are locked at 8.50am. Children should be in school by 8.45am as teaching starts very promptly.

Finally a very warm welcome to our new families joining us this year. We hope to get to know you all over the coming months and years. Pyrford is a big and busy school and we know it can be 'information overload' at times so please don't hesitate to ask any of us if you have a question.
