HOT TOPIC: INCLUSION



What does Inclusion involve at Pyrford?

The Inclusion Team at Pyrford work with a large number of children across the school. Children may need support for a variety of reasons, these can include; additional learning needs, medical support, managing challenging situations both at home and at school, managing physical needs and managing sensory needs.

Inclusion support work may involve I:I work with a teacher or teaching assistant, small group work or following a personalised curriculum or plan of support. We use a variety of approaches to support children and these can include more creative or play based approaches.

As part of the Inclusion provision we offer, we also work extensively with families in order to provide the best support possible to the children in our school.

Are all children who are supported by the Inclusion Team on the SEN register?

No. Children may access support for a short period of time from the Inclusion Team and so would not be on the SEN register. This is often the case for children receiving pastoral support.

What does it mean if my child is on the SEN register?

If it is decided that a child needs provision for a sustained period which is **additional to or different from** that made for others of the same age, they are added to the SEN register under the category of SEN Support. A one page profile and an individual support plan (ISP) will be written, ensuring targeted support. Parents and children are involved in this process and we review the children's progress on a termly basis. If we feel that sufficient progress has been made and a child no longer requires additional provision, they will be removed from the SEN register.

What kinds of interventions are run at Pyrford?

We offer a wide range of evidence based interventions at Pyrford. Interventions are used to deliver learning support as well as social, emotional and mental health support. More information can be found on the school website under the SEND tab.

Children do not have to be on the SEN register to participate in interventions.

All interventions are monitored by the Inclusion Lead and progress as well as cost effectiveness is measured termly.

What outside agencies do the Inclusion Team work with?

We use a range of services such as:

- Speech and Language Therapy
- Educational Psychology
- Learning and Language Support
- Physiotherapy
- Physical and Sensory Support Service
- Occupational Therapy
- Behaviour Support Service
- Education Welfare Officer Service
- Children's Services
- The Virtual School
- Advice and support from the school nurse
- Advice and support from Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service (CAMHS)

Before the school makes a referral to any specialist service we will always gain a parent/carers permission.




Can you spare 5-10 mins after drop-off once a fortnight?

On the day, please send in your runners with trainers, PE kit and a waterproof.




After the run, please collect your donations and return with your form in an envelope marked FUN RUN, to the PTA box in the office.
