

Headteacher's Letter

Good morning.

It has been a glorious week weather-wise and we have been lucky enough to get as much outdoor learning done as possible. Fingers crossed this will continue into next week when we are starting our extensive programme of trips and visits.

Behind the scenes, we've had a busy time dealing with covid cases in school. I am sorry to report that cases have continued to grow and reducing the spread is proving challenging. To confirm, government guidance stipulates that for children only those who have a positive PCR test should isolate. NHS track and trace will inform the positive case how long they should isolate for. Siblings should attend school as normal and continue to lateral flow test, but also take a PCR test if they have symptoms - only if this is retuned positive should they then isolate. I appreciate that families are struggling with this advice, and it makes the spread of covid much harder to limit in school. We have contacted the DfE, local authority and PHE regarding our rising cases and, at the moment, we are not advised to take any additional measures on top of what we are already doing. This is reviewed daily. We have taken the decision to limit any whole school activities such as collective worship indoors and break and lunch times are staggered as much as possible. Classrooms are well ventilated and we continue our catch it, kill it, bin it mantra. Children are reminded to wash hands regularly and to use the hand sanitation stations around the school.

In the case of a positive PCR test, school work is provided but please note, if your child is ill, we certainly don't expect them to complete work. The virus seems to affect people differently with some being very unwell to those who are asymptomatic. I will continue to inform parents if your child is likely to have been a close contact and urge you to get a PCR test for them. The lateral flow kits which can be ordered via the NHS are now coming with a PCR test also included.

Anyway, on to perkier news! Next week we have our first set of visits taking place. Year 3 are off to Butser Farm to support their learning as part of the History curriculum and Year 6 are heading off to Marwell Zoo to support their work in Science. We are also looking forward to welcoming prospective new parents to visit the school (something we weren't able to do last year). We are also holding coffee get togethers for Years 2 and 4 next week, so do please check the calendar for dates. Our thanks to Year 5 parents who came in this week. It was good to see you and to be able to talk through some of the questions you had and to reflect on feedback.

One of the things I have mentioned before is about getting parents back into the school building and as such we will be holding 'Friendly Fridays'. These will be held on the first 3 Fridays of each half term and are an opportunity for you to pop into your child's classroom to see their work and touch base with staff if you need to. These will run from 3.15pm-3.45pm. The full schedule of dates is overleaf.

Tomorrow we are holding our first ever Autumn Festival which is a great opportunity for families in the community to see each other. Many thanks in advance for supporting the school (in fact it has been so popular that it has completely sold out. Sorry, there is no capacity on the day for turn ups, this is a ticketed event). Do pop by the bar to say hello to the staff team! My sincere thanks to the PTA and class reps who have pulled this exciting event together. We don't underestimate the planning involved! Can I put in a quick plea to be mindful of covid planning put in place and to please take any rubbish home with you - with bin collections limited, the school also suffers and we really need our bins kept for school weekly waste. If rubbish piles up then our 'furry friends' like to visit and I'm not a fan!

I look forward to seeing many of you at the weekend event.


