Australasia/ Oceania	Australasia is the world's smallest continent. The Great Barrier reef is a coral reef. Australasia is the flattest continent.	
Europe	Europe is the second smallest continent in size. There are 50 countries in Europe. Foxes, deer and rabbits live in Europe.	
North America	North America is the third largest continent. It has 23 countries. Mississippi is a river in North America. Disney World in Florida is in North America. The Grand Canyon is in North America. Moose and brown bears live in North America.	
South America	The Amazon River is in South America. There are 12 countries Llamas and capybara live in South America. Chocolate, pineapple and peanuts all grow in South America.
