



Barcelona and Guildford



Guildford is a town in Surrey, 27 miles southwest of London. The town has a population of about 80,000. There is a general street market held on Fridays and Saturdays and a farmers' market is usually held on the first Tuesday of each month. Barcelona is a city on the coast of northeastern Spain. It is the capital and largest city of the community of Catalonia, as well as the second most populous district of Spain. With a population of 1.6 million within its city limits, making it the sixth most populous urban area in the European Union.
