Christopher Columbus was a Spanish explorer. He was born in 1451 and he died in 1506.

Key Knowledge

The explorer Christopher Columbus made four trips across the Atlantic Ocean from Spain: in 1492, 1493, 1498 and 1502. He was determined to find a direct water route west from Europe to Asia, but he never did. Instead, he accidentally found the Americas. Though he did not really "discover" the so-called New World—millions of people already lived there—his journeys marked the beginning of centuries of exploration.

Columbus has a controversial legacy — he is remembered as a daring and path-breaking explorer who transformed the New World, yet his actions also made changes that would eventually devastate the native populations he and his fellow explorers encountered.
