		Teachers carry out assessments of the children in all areas of the curriculum at the end of each term. Data meetings are held termly with SLT.
		The children's attainment, effort and attitudes to learning are reported termly to parents as part of the written report. Parents Evenings are held twice a year where we discuss pupil progress and barriers to learning.
		Attainment is measured using the statutory assessments at the end of Reception, Key Stage One and Two. These results are measured against the attainment of children nationally.
