This week as always has been a hive of activity both in school and out. I started my week by attending the South East and South London Academies conference. This was a fantastic opportunity to hear inspiring leaders from around the country speak about the work they are doing, as well as catching up with colleagues from the South East who are running academy trusts. I was fortunate enough to meet with the two leads from the DfE who are championing the latest government priority on reducing teacher workload. Damian Hinds is putting substantial pressure and expectation on school leaders to reduce the workload of teachers whilst we weather the financial storms and current recruitment and retention crisis in

On Thursday Mrs McAllister and myself were also fortunate enough to have an audience with Damian Hinds (Secretary of State for Education) and Nick Gibb (Minister for Schools). The message coming from the top was that we should feel empowered to run our schools to meet the needs of our school communities with freedom, diversity and accountability. Damian Hinds reiterated the need for us as school leaders to not let bureaucracy take us away from what is important - the children! Of course the session covered many topics - the highlights reported in the press this morning perhaps don't truly reflect all that was discussed. Nevertheless an interesting meeting with plenty of food for thought and the message to keep doing all the good work we are already doing.

In school much has been going on with our curriculum development and our drive and focus on feedback to pupils, in order to embed learning and set challenging targets for individuals. Teachers have been working hard this term to plan lesson scaffolds for the week. Then each night after school they meet in year group teams to debrief the lessons taught and assess where pupils learning is at, in order to plan for the next day. Evidence to date is showing that this is having significant impact on pupils' progress across the curriculum, which we will be able to report to you at the upcoming parent meetings.

Of course, life is not just about reading and writing and we are very keen to promote an enriched curriculum at Pyrford. We are privileged to have pupils who have a multitude of interests and talents. I would like to point parents in the direction of the 'slottr' which is being circulated. We are desperately seeking adult volunteers to help man the football coaching which is being delivered by Woking Football Club. In response to feedback from parents in the questionnaire last year, the school and PTA have worked hard behind the scenes to provide free clubs for pupils. The football has been highly successful which is fantastic however we NEED additional parent help to run this. Despite my pleas last week, no one has volunteered an hour of their time. The school is providing volunteer staffing where it can. If we do not get volunteers by next week we are left with no option but to limit numbers and you will receive information as to when your child can attend. As a heads up, Woking Borough Council are looking to put in double yellow lines on the roads around the school. You will all be aware that illegal parking and dangerous driving near the school has been an ongoing issue. There is consultation at the moment and I am unsure as to exactly when the enforcement might be in place. I wanted to give you advance warning so that you can make alternative arrangements if you drive to school as you will need to park significantly further from the school. Please can I also draw your attention to the fact that I have been notified that there are still some parents choosing to drop pupils on the zigzag lines outside the school. We have a collective responsibility to look after our children.

Many thanks to our Yr R parents this week who attended the phonics and maths workshop. Your support is greatly appreciated. Our offer to all parents at any time though is to please ask us if you have a question; please don't feel that you have to wait until parents' meetings. Feel free to send in an email and we will get back to you as soon as we can.

Finally another thanks to everyone who has kindly donated food for Woking Food Bank at our Harvest festival celebration. This is greatly appreciated.




