Year 5 had their self defence classes this week which went down a storm. The children were really enthusiastic and joined in with the sessions eagerly. Many thanks to the PTA for fully funding this activity.

This evening, the PTA are holding the annual school BBQ. I'm sure it will be good fun! Please can I ask parents to take all rubbish and recycle at home so that the school site is kept as clean and tidy as possible.
