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Good morning and welcome to our penultimate newsletter of the year.

These meetings are invaluable to us as a school and provide a real team around the child approach where the receiving teacher is also able to be present. The meetings also provide us with an opportunity to analyse what is going well in the school with regards to teaching and learning and what we need to review. When we have completed this analysis we will let you all know what our priorities are for next year and how you as parents can best support your child.

It was lovely this week for us to hold our awards assemblies. I was privileged to be able to give out the awards at the KS1 assembly and was able to briefly pop in to the KS2 assembly before having to whizz off down the A3 for a meeting. Huge congratulations to all of the children who gained the very well deserved awards and thank you to parents for attending and supporting your child.

Rehearsals seem to be well underway for the Year 6 showcase which the children have put together. They will be showing this to the rest of the school in the coming days and to Year 6 parents next Friday.

Year 3 pupils took part in the self defence classes this week which the PTA kindly funded. The children were thoroughly engaged in the session and have hopefully gained some new skills. Year 3 continued to be busy and held their World War 2 celebration this week. The children looked great in their evacuation outfits and enjoyed the activities including the authentic Anderson shelter which again the PTA had bought and refurbished for them. It is situated in the environmental garden in the school grounds.

My thanks to the Year 2 parents and staff team who ran the BBQ last Friday night. This was a good night attended by many and helps celebrate the community where we work together.

Next week remains full on with a whole list of events and activities taking place. Please check the calendar later in the newsletter, as well as emails from school and your class reps.

Tomorrow is the annual Pyrford & Wisley Flower Show. The children have all entered items for the various categories for judging, so please do stop by and have a look to see if your child is a winner. 

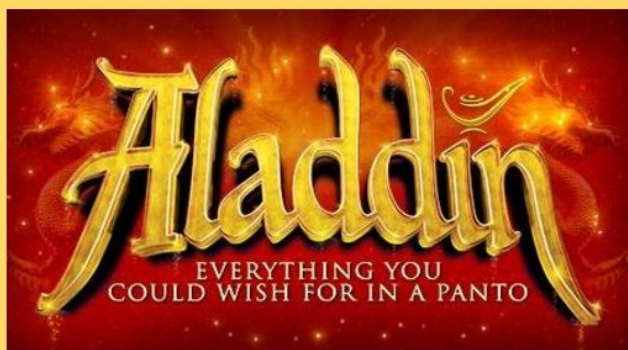
Cut-price Panto Tickets at New Victoria Theatre, Woking
