Our Belarus children have also been in school this week enjoying the school lunches as well as the play equipment. It is wonderful each year to see how much progress this group of children make with their health and wellbeing whilst visiting Woking.

We welcomed Trustees from the Humphrey Richardson Taylor music foundation to the school this week. The Trust sponsored the music building and so Trustees came to see the finished project which we had originally bid for. They were delighted to see the Year 4 pupils undertaking their whole class brass lessons and were inspired by how well the children were doing. The Trust were so impressed they have agreed to consider further bids to secure more instruments as they saw how far reaching our music provision was.

Next Saturday is our planned Summer Fayre. Thanks to year groups who have been signing up on their class 'slotter' sheets. You will see later in the newsletter that class reps are appealing for more help on some of the stalls, so please consider helping. It really makes a difference if we all do a small part then the onus is not always on the same people. 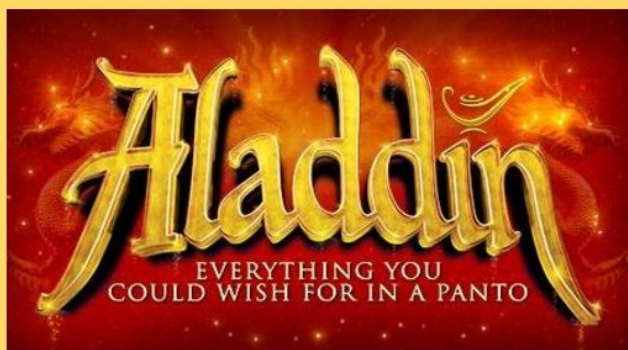
## Cut-price Panto Tickets at New Victoria Theatre, Woking
