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Good morning. Well I am pleased that the Fun Run event was last week and not this! We shall look forward to hearing how they got on and how the adults have coped without the luxury of a hairdryer!

Whilst year 5 are out having fun, years 2 and 6 will undertake the national SATs testing. If your child is in Year 6 it is imperative that they are in school and on time every day. The SATs testing for Year 6 pupils is highly regulated and as such we have to stick to strict time guidelines regarding locked and sealed papers. If you foresee any issues at all at home, please ring in to school as soon as possible in the morning and one of the team can help. We try as best we can to make these national tests as stress free as possible and we will be reminding children of fun times ahead as soon as the last tests on Thursday have been completed. Year 2 testing is much more laid back and takes place over an agreed time frame rather than at set national days and times. 
