This was a great opportunity for the children to learn more in-depth information about the soldiers fighting in World War I. The children around the school have been learning about that period of time and Year 5 have produced this display of poppies and soldiers.

On 7th of November Year 6 went to Guildford Cathedral, to learn about WW1 and its consequences on the world. They also learned about war today and refugees. They had a two minute silence to reflect on those who have fallen in the war.

Our day started off with Robin (from Footprints Theatre), who was performing a theatre show about the soldiers on the English and the German sides of the war in WW1. He acted out the truce of 1914 and the fighting; he even made some of the teachers cry! After that we split off into our four groups which were named after battles. We did four activities, which helped us reflect throughout the day, one of the activities was about Edith Cavell. She was a nurse during the Great War and helped smuggle wounded soldiers into Holland which was a neutral country. Then we made a bravery medal craft.

Another activity, was asking Fergy and El hart (Robin) questions about the war. We asked them what it was like during the war and how their minds changed about each other.

We also learned about peace and how we can spread it everywhere, we wrote peace message or prayer on a dove and finally played a board game about refugee circumstances.

To finish off our day, we had a mini service with Cannon Paul the vicar of the church where we played a remembrance memory game, thank you Guildford Cathedral!
