Year 2 and Year 6 pupils have undertaken the SATs papers. For Y2, this has been very low key and the children have been able to carry on working at a leisurely pace. Today Year 6 are enjoying a little down time and are having a celebratory end of exams party this afternoon. My thanks to the staff who give their all throughout the school to support the children. Poor Mrs Wright has been ill this week yet has dragged herself in so that she was here to support her class, whilst a whole team of staff across the school pulled out all the stops to provide booster lessons, invigilate in exams and provide access arrangements for those pupils who require them.

Whilst everyone has been hard at work, Year 5 have been enjoying the outdoor life. They have been on their camping trip which they have loved, enjoying a completely different life to the one they lead at home! The primitive camping experience and challenges given to the children were a much greater shock for the adults who spent most of the first day getting over their shared outside toilet and lack of showers and electricity. However everyone is now expert in outdoor cooking. Staff have reported how fabulous the food is and how good the staff at the centre are. We are so grateful to her for all that she has done to support the children, coming in on her day off this week, and even more grateful that she has volunteered to carry on helping in Year 6 next half term.

The Tropical Zoo are paying us a visit next week at school, so I am sure those classes involved will enjoy meeting and greeting all the animals and reptiles who will be brought by their handlers. It is also Prayer Week which has been organised by the Church of the Good Shepherd. Every class in the school will be visiting the church next door to undertake a variety of prayer activities. Our thanks to the wonderful team over at the Good Shepherd for all their work and support for our children.


