Breakfast Club

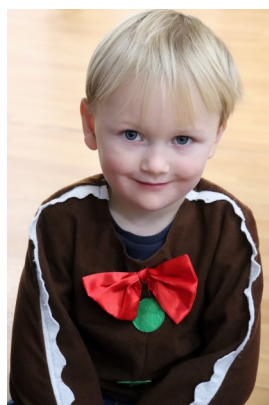
