

Pyrford Church of England Primary School

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Good morning and welcome to our second full week of the term. We are now fully into the swing of things here. Children are settled in their new classes and are working hard.

This week we had our first trip out of school with Year 3 heading off to Butser Ancient Farm, where the children engaged in a number of activities to launch their learning about Romans and Celts. Children enjoyed making clay pots, spinning wool and making jewellery all linked to that period of time. Many thanks as always to the adults who ran the trip and to parents who also supported staff on the visit.

A number of you have attended the curriculum year group workshops with class teachers this week and we will continue to roll out this programme next week. We will ensure everyone gets a copy of the presentations in due course so that hopefully it will act as a reminder over the year and also answer any questions for parents who weren't able to attend.

On the staff news front, Mrs Hoare will sadly be leaving us next Friday. Mrs Hoare works as part of our Inclusion team supporting children and families and will be sadly missed. We wish her well as she continues her work with Inclusion, working for Surrey County Council visiting families and children in their homes who fail to attend school regularly. I am sure our paths will cross as the school works closely with this team. As a reminder to parents, all pupils are expected to have attendance above 95%. All our pupils are tracked half termly and are discussed with Inclusion officers at Surrey. This school expects school attendance to be above 97%.

Our Inclusion leader, Mrs Pollard had her baby over the summer holidays. Lucas Pollard was born on the 4th of August and weighed in at a very healthy 9lb 11.5oz. Mrs Pollard is doing well and Evie is loving being a big sister.

I've had my first request from our neighbours this week to speak to parents about the parking outside the front of the school. Neighbours are unhappy about having their driveways blocked and parking on the grass verge on Coldharbour Road. They claim that both parking and driving is dangerous and puts children's lives at risk. In order to alleviate some of the parking, please remember that the gates are opened at 8.30am and all KS2 puils can happily be left safely on the school grounds. Doors open promptly at 8.40am to allow a staggered entry and close again at 8.50am. Pupils who arrive after the doors have closed need to report to the school office where a parent will need to sign them in and they are marked late. At the end of the day, Reception and KS1 pupils finish at 3.10pm and KS2 pupils at 3.15pm. This 5 minute lag is to allow parent to collect younger children before collecting older siblings.

Behind the scenes, teachers have continued to work on curriculum philosophy and developing rich learning experiences for our children. We will be sharing our curriculum work with you over the coming year.

The weather looks good again for the weekend, so I hope you manage to enjoy it whilst it lasts!




Cut-price Panto Tickets at New Victoria Theatre, Woking
