Good morning. Despite the dark, dank weather outside, school is a hive of activity. A huge thank you for the kind donations which have been sent in today for the Christmas Fayre, they are greatly appreciated. Our week started with Remembrance Day. Children took part in an assembly, followed by the 2 minute silence later in the morning and some children went up to visit the war memorial in Pyrford to tie in with some of the work they had been doing.

Very excitingly, our playground markings have been installed on the back playground. Having been told that we would have to wait until next week, we received a call early in the week to say the installation team were on their way. The children absolutely love playing on these and they really brighten up the school environment. My thanks to Mrs Murray for organising and to the PTA for funding this.



It was good to see so many parents attending the parents evenings this week. Hopefully you were able to spend time with your child's teacher, understanding how your child's learning is progressing. As I mentioned last week, we will be sending out written reports for children in December so that you are kept up to date with their progress and attitudes to learning

You should have received an email yesterday from the school with regards to an update on the flu immunisation programme. I have been asked by various local residents to remind parents of dangerous parking, driving and, in particular, a plea for parents to turn off car engines whilst waiting to collect your children from school. I would be really grateful to parents for your support in this. Each week I receive a number of complaints about inconsiderate parents. Our job in school is to spend the time with the children, which they deserve in order to support them; having to deal with complaints about parents' behaviour detracts us from this.
