Despite the continued concerns locally and nationally with the spread of the coronavirus, the children have been able to continue to access all of our planned activities.

Year 6 have attended a Greek workshop this week. The children were fully engaged in the day, full of enthusiasm and fired up about their learning around the Greeks. The theme of alternative dressing continued with our celebration of World Book Day 2020 on Thursday. I'm sure your children will have told you all about the texts they have been studying and the work they carried out, as well as the story swap which happened across the classes during the day. Some children decided to come dressed as book characters, some came in pyjamas and others chose to wear their own mufti. We are extremely grateful to parents who have purchased books from our Amazon wishlists. As you will be aware, we are driving reading and writing in our school and have been spending long days and nights sorting all of our books in the school. When we were sorting out the library books, we became very aware that whilst Google and Wikipedia had taken over information texts, our actual books had not kept pace, so we have been looking at updating our non fiction books. Our fiction books also needed updating/replacing as they get used so much. The books you have been purchasing will help make a big difference to the children throughout the entire school and will support teaching and learning in the classroom. We are also extremely grateful for the good quality books you have been sending in from home. As you can imagine, with over 500 pupils in the school we need a book stock of thousands.

We are continuing our project work with the elderly members of our community and another group of children have visited our friends in the nursing home over in Send. This is so beneficial for both intergenerational parties.

This week, Mrs Gill took a group of children to St. Andrews School to participate in a singing event. The children enjoyed the day and were enthused on their return. Next week, continuing our musical theme, Year 5 pupils are visiting Fullbrook School for the day where they will be watching their production of Les Miserables.

This week I have become acutely aware of the very active use of Whatsapp groups. Please can I remind everyone that in school we constantly work with children to remind them of their digital footprint. As adults, we have a duty to promote safe, measured responses. Whilst Whatsapp and other social media groups can provide an invaluable communication tool, during the recent news concerning coronavirus outbreaks, this has not been helpful in the school community and placed additional workload on staff members. **Larch** - Ava Embling for writing a lovely prayer about friendship.


**Cherry** - Harrison Barnes for working hard on his maths, especially adding fractions.






