

### **Pyrford Church of England Primary School**

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Good morning. I can't quite believe that Friday has arrived already although I'm certainly not complaining!

As you will remember, last week children attended the O2 Arena to sing with the Young Voices. This was a fabulous evening and enjoyed by all. Thanks to parents who have provided such positive feedback and of course to staff who gave up their time to supervise the children.

We've had a lot of trips and visits this week to support our curriculum work. Year 5 arrived on Tuesday dressed in their Viking costumes and enjoyed a great day of workshops. The children were really enthusiastic and have learned a plethora of facts and information about that period of history. Meanwhile, Year I supported their curriculum work this week with a trip to Windsor Castle. Again another great day out with lots learnt about the monarchy. The children enjoyed some interactive workshops and talks in the Garter Room, so felt very important. Thanks again to staff for taking out young children to a public place (this is never easy and requires extensive risk assessments!) Thanks also to Mrs Jones who joined the staff; we do try and convince her to be here on a more regular basis!

Year 4 visited the Synagogue this week in order to support their learning about Judaism. Again lots of information learnt and some great experiential learning opportunities. Next week our Year 3 children are heading out to Pizza Express to make pizzas as part of their DT work around food. This visit is always well received by the children.

I wanted to particularly highlight our children and their recent Maths success. Our children took part in a national maths challenge and the feedback we have had has been wonderful. Children in Upper KS2 competed against I4 local schools and over 800 schools in the entire country. 'The standard shown over the country was incredibly high. The Pyrford team displayed amazing perseverance, the challenge this year was the toughest yet and Pyrford were the only team in Woking to find all the solutions. An achievement they should be incredibly proud of. We saw great displays of leadership, initiative and resilience, all great attributes to help them with problem solving and team work.' Maths is a real strength of this school and we were pleased and proud that our children performed so well.

No doubt, your children will have filled you in on our recent 'health and hygiene' talks in assembly. Following on from my newsletter last week, there are still incidences of poor hygiene with regards to bathroom use. We have been teaching children the importance of self care and appropriate bathroom behaviour. Please help us by reinforcing at home. We are still having odd incidences of someone taking a pen into the toilet and using the wall instead of paper to demonstrate their academic ability - whilst only minor markings are found, I still do not find this acceptable behaviour and does not uphold the values in our school. This has been highlighted to me as my staff and I are currently cleaning all of the bathrooms on a daily basis. The school has had issues with a new cleaning contract and as such have entered into a new contract. However we are needing to fill the gap until the new team are fully inducted and in place. I am indebted to my staff team who always go above and beyond for the school community. Each evening (and weekends) at the moment, staff have worked freely to clean and maintain the school so that we all have a nice environment to work and learn in. We are now all becoming protective over the areas we are maintaining and vying for the envious title of 'Mrs Hinch'.

As you will start to have noticed, the daylight hours are slowly extending and our outdoor clubs which run after school are back up and running. Again, do check the school website for details.

Next week we are celebrating National Storytelling Week and we would like the children to bring in their favourite book to share with their class. It is also Mental Health Awareness Week - we will be discussing mental health and completing some activities around this theme during the entire term. We are keen to promote mental health awareness and hope to provide our young people with strategies to help them have healthy minds as well as healthy bodies.




