

#### Headteacher's Letter

Good morning, what a glorious week!

This week has really felt like things are getting back to 'normal'. It has been great to have parents in school either sharing a coffee, attending a welcome meeting or at KS2 sports day. Thank you to everyone who has made it to one of the school events this week. The children love it when parents come into school and get a glimpse into their world.

On that note, we were sorry to have to postpone our EYFS/KS1 sports day today. Having received a Heat Health Alert from the local authority, reminding us of the many heat-related health issues, we simply couldn't risk our smallest children. I am pleased to tell you that the new date for this is now **Friday 8th July - KS1 09:00-10:30, EYFS 10:30-12:00.** 

Mrs Clement, our new head of school, has been working with us in school this week and will continue to pop in for various meetings and events before joining us full-time in September. She is busy juggling the two schools but hopes to get the opportunity to meet you ahead of the new term. She is intending on being at the coffee morning for Years 1 and 2 on Tuesday.

The PTA have been very busy over the last couple of weeks planning for events during this academic year and next. We are keen to engage families in a plethora of fundraising events so that we can support and enhance the educational experience for the children in the school. We are raising money towards further IT equipment and to restock our non-fiction library. Please keep an eye on the newsletter for information about what is happening and when.

Much continues to take place next week, with Monday and Wednesday designated as class photo day. Please see the table on the following page for when your child's class will be photographed. Please send children in correct, clean uniform and we will try our best to keep them neat and tidy for the photo.

Year 6 are heading out on Tuesday for a leavers service at Guildford Cathedral where the children will take part in a number of activities as well as a church service alongside other church schools in Guildford Diocese. This is always a lovely event for children to know they are part of the wider church family and serves as a great memory of their primary years. For us, it will be the opportunity to engage in this normally annual event for the first time since 2019.

Year 4 are participating in a Chinese dragon workshop on Wednesday so we look forward to seeing their engagement and will share some photos with you.

Years 5 and 6 are invited to Friendly Friday on the 24th, and for some of you this will be the last time you may be in your child's class before you leave us and move on to secondary school. So, if you get the time, please do pop in and see your child's work and celebrate all that has been achieved this year. Behind the scenes we are busy working with our secondary colleagues preparing to transition children, which is no easy feat when we have children attending over 12 different secondary schools.

Our week will culminate with our Year 4 children participating in the Surrey Brass Ensemble Concert. This is again, another annual event which is able to take place this year for the first time in a while. Our Year 4 children are invited to play with the Surrey brass ensembles which include children of all ages from across Surrey. It is a great night and luckily, Mr Chapple organises it to be held in the Church of the Good Shepherd so it's very easy to access for our children. We have secured the services of Mr Chapple for 2023 so will continue our great brass tradition at Pyrford with our Year 4 cohort next year.

I wrote to Alder class parents last week to let them know that unfortunately, Mrs Bourne would not be able to teach the class for the remainder of this academic year. I have been fortunate enough to speak with Mrs Bourne, who is currently at a hospital in London with her daughter Chloe who has been diagnosed with leukaemia. Chloe is receiving treatment and being an absolute trooper and the family have just been told that her treatment can continue at home from this weekend. This is a huge relief for them all, if a little daunting. Chloe is severely immunocompromised and if her brother William were to bring something back home, particularly infectious diseases like chicken pox, measles etc, it would be really serious for her. They ask, therefore, that Elm Class parents are particularly cautious and keep any poorly children at home. I am sure you will join us in sending our love and prayers to the Bourne family during this difficult time. We have a collection and card in the school office if anyone would like to contribute or leave a message.
