I don't think any of us could have predicted what 2020 was to bring us. I know everyone in the school community is hanging on for the final stretch to Christmas, in the hope of meeting up with your bubble of 3 households.


Whilst is has undoubtedly been a challenging time for us all, there have been so many fond and uplifting memories that I will take with me for the rest of my life. I reflected this week on the dark day 'March 20^{th'} – forever etched in my brain. I clearly remember calling our 82 staff to a final briefing, where we stood distanced in the long corridor after we'd closed the doors to the children. As I gave my talk to the staff, there wasn't a dry eye from any of us. For me, that was the moment I knew life would not be the 'normal' we had known.

From that day on though, we had a purpose, a job to do. We fondly became a lockdown school family. Staff volunteered their time in school to look after children and to cook and clean for us. No one moaned about working contracts or the fact that they'd given up their weekends, school holidays and bank holidays - together we did it for the children. They rallied as a true team. Parents sent supportive messages which helped us get through those uncertain times. We knew you were all struggling too with the changes to your life and the novelty of home educating soon wearing off. However as a community, we all learnt how to communicate using new technology. We learned the importance of family and friends and perhaps re-evaluated what was important to us in our lives. Our children learned new skills, to be a little more self-sufficient and to have amazing IT skills which we would never have had the time to cover in the curriculum.

No-one wrote the manual or the training programme for 'leading and managing in a pandemic'. However, I think as a school community we've done our best. We know we haven't been able to keep everyone happy all of the time, but please be assured that your children are happy at school. They have readily adapted to all of our new routines without question.

I am hopeful that with a vaccine now within our grasp, we will all learn from our experiences and use the best things to make a better future for ourselves and our children.

I would like to thank you all for your unwavering support of the school this year. Every single one of you returned after the lockdown in September which is testament to your faith in us. I have been astounded by the support which has been offered by individuals and groups of you who want to help in different ways. THANK YOU.



We have made it to the final stretch of a term like no other. This week we have had four lots of Christmas lunches, an elf visit and filming of various performances, whilst still carrying out assessments, teaching and learning.

You will no doubt have seen this week's announcement from the DfE regarding schools having Thursday next week as the last day of teaching (no issues for us as term was due to finish on that day anyway). However I do need to make you aware of the track and trace procedures in place. Schools are responsible for track and trace until 23rd December.

We will get back to you and will work with PHE and Surrey CC to identify pupils/ staff who will then need to isolate and the period of time isolation is required.

We will contact those of you who need to isolate via text message and email with the relevant information.

After 23rd December

NHS Track and Trace will support you and will identify close contacts.

We hope that everyone keeps safe and well over the festive period. Next week in school will be critical in trying to keep everyone safe. Please may I ask that if your child has any illness, you keep them at home. I know children don't want to miss out on end of term plans but numbers of cases have rapidly increased locally amongst children, so we really need to be cautious. Many local schools are struggling to keep open at all and positive cases next week will inevitably have an impact on our school community and your Christmas plans.

Christmas Pause Day The whole school will focus on the Christian element of Christmas. All children will participate in workshop and prayer led activities, as well as arts and craft activities focussing on the nativity story and the birth of Jesus.




Christmas Pause Day Monday 14th December
