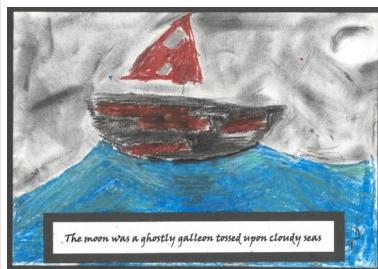

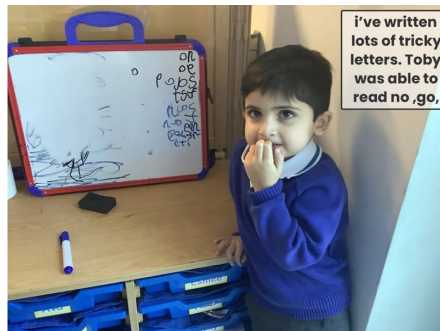
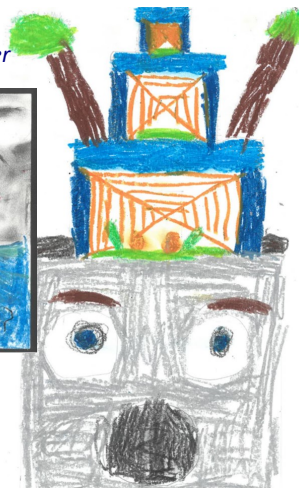

Good morning. What a week!

I'd like to start by thanking you for your offers of help following my letter to you all earlier this week. We have been severely impacted by staff absence and whilst I am hopeful the situation will improve, I wanted to get a plan in place just in case the situation does worsen in terms of staff being unwell. I am absolutely resolute that we will put every contingency in place, so that children can attend school and will not switch to home learning. I know there have been many press articles this week about schools closing because of staff absence, which is why I wanted to plan ahead for the worst case rather than end up in crisis. Thank you to staff, parents and governors who have all stepped up as a school community to ensure we can keep everything going as planned.

Year 2 enjoyed a Great Fire of London workshop this week, (*see page 3*) linked to their work in the history curriculum. The children were full of enthusiasm and chat about the event, sharing all the knowledge they had gained.

The highlight of my week was having the opportunity to just chat to parents in the EYFS and Year 4 coffee mornings. It is so nice to be able to meet parents on a more social level. We are hoping to roll out more coffee mornings and plan to use a different location in the school which is a bit more comfortable (rather than having to stand-up in a chilly hall!)

Thank you for the masses of donations for the Christmas Fayre - they are very much appreciated. The children are enjoying wearing mufti clothes to school today too. It is nice to have some of the activities back which we haven't experienced for a long time.

Next week we continue our planned programme of activities and look forward to the Christmas Fayre and Tree Sale on Saturday 4th December. It will be lovely to get together again for the benefit of all the children in school. We are all trying our best to make it as safe as possible for everyone, with as many of the stalls outside.

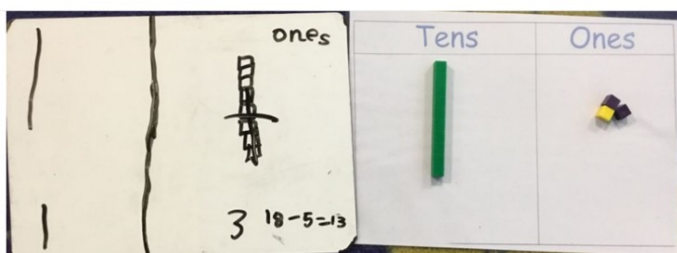

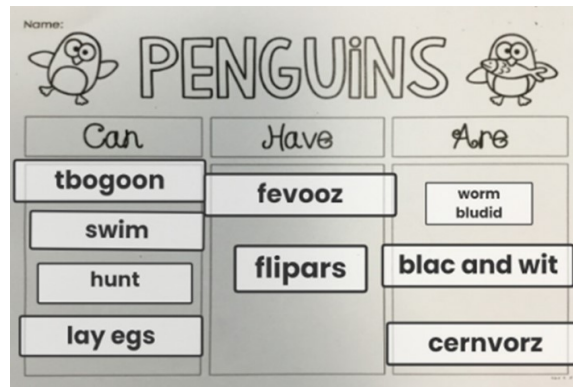
