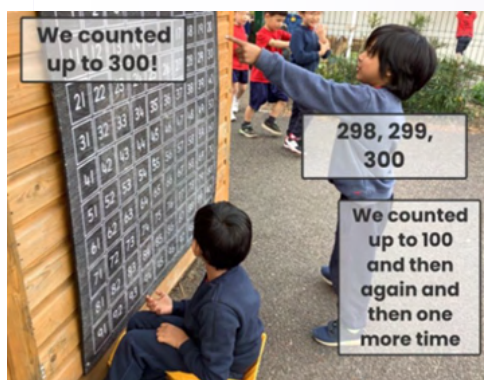

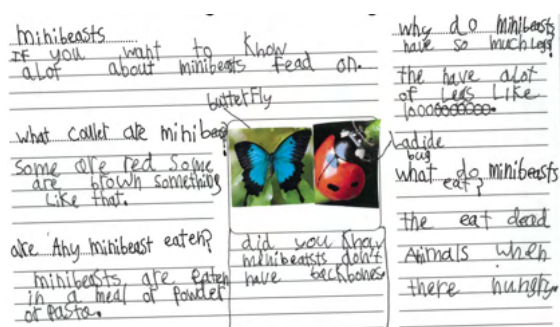

Good morning. As always, another busy week in school. There has been a real buzz around the school with the arrival of our chicks and ducklings. You will see from our photos how our new visitors are settling in. Our week started with Year 6 taking part in their Greek workshop. Children had a really engaging day, learning about all aspects of the ancient Greeks. They carried out activities in the main hall as well as in classrooms. Children participated in a play which was filmed and then shared the next day with them on the screens in the classroom. It has been great to see how we can still deliver engaging activities within our Covid safe environment. Year 5 had an equally exciting day as they participated in a Viking workshop and activities in just the same way on Tuesday. Many thanks to parents who put together costumes for their children to wear during these events.

Swimming sessions started up this week and what a poor weather week it has been! Despite all the logistical challenges of the lessons, the children have loved them and when they stop me for a chat, it is great to hear from them what fun it was. The children were very keen to tell me how warm the pool was. We are pleased that so many children have the opportunity to do this at our school.

Our learning visits continue next week when our younger children are having a visit from Millers Ark Farm. The farm are visiting our school field for two days next week and the children in YN, YR and Y1 will all visit the farm animals and have the opportunity to take part in some animal handling. Children will visit the farm in smaller Covid safe bubbles and full handwashing procedures are in place. I am sure the children (and staff) will love it!

Next week will also see the full rollout across the school of our daily mile pledge. We are keen to get our children fully active and with careful planning, we think we've managed to find time and space for every class to participate in this initiative. What is The Daily Mile?

The aim of The Daily Mile is to improve the physical, social, emotional and mental health, and wellbeing of our children – regardless of age, ability or personal circumstances.

It is a profoundly simple but effective concept, which any school can implement completely free of charge and without the need for staff training. Its impact can be transformational – improving not only the children's fitness, but also their attainment, mood, behaviour and general wellbeing. The Daily Mile is not sport or PE, but health and wellbeing through daily physical activity.

Children are encouraged to jog or run outside for 15 minutes every day at a time of their teacher's choosing. In this time, most children will average a mile or more distance – and so, The Daily Mile is born!

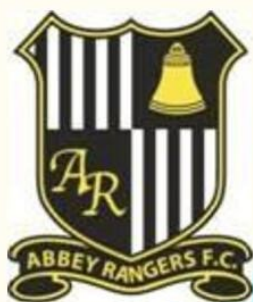
