

Headteacher's Letter

A very warm welcome back to everyone. I do hope you enjoyed some time together over the Easter break or at least a little respite from the school run.

We have hit term at full pace as always and it has been a joy to wave off the Year 4 children on their residential trip to Hindleap Warren. I am sure they will have had a great time, although parents, please be prepared to collect dirty, tired children later today! My sincere thanks to the staff and volunteers who give up their unpaid time to look after the children, 24 hours a day is no easy feat! We will post some pictures next week so you can see what the children got up to. Those who didn't attend have been busy doing other jobs in school including some costume and scenery design and painting in anticipation of a production that they are putting together later this term.

Reception class offers have now been made from Surrey for those starting school in September 2022. Please can we ask you to respond as soon as possible so that we can confirm spaces. To those in our school community who weren't offered a space and are still keen to come, please contact Mrs Anderson as soon as possible so that you can be added to the waiting list. We are always happy to help and advise parents, but make no guarantee of spaces.

We are very hopeful of a more 'normal' term with far less Covid impact. Thank you to parents for supporting the beginning and end of day arrangements, we know we have a little more ironing out to do but we should get there! Children have been amazing in the mornings, coming straight in and cracking on with learning, leaving no wasted time in the day. We have also changed the lunch times in school so that we can now extend the length of PE sessions/hall teaching time as we are able to clear the hall by 1pm, get floors mopped and dried and be ready to hit afternoon lessons in there by 1.15pm. Trust me, it has been no easy job trying to feed over 500 children, keep them separated and turn around hall times - we run a very tight timetable!

With regards to protocols around Covid, the school is following the latest guidance <u>People with symptoms of a respiratory infection including COVID-19 -</u> <u>GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)</u>

In a nutshell, if your child takes a Covid19 test and tests positive, they should stay at home for 3 days and return as soon after that if they are well enough. If your child has symptoms but does not take a test, the child should attend school, assuming they are well enough to do so. Children with a high temperature should stay at home until this has passed. There is no need for anyone to isolate for 10 days any longer. School work will not be provided for children who are off school ill as they are deemed too unwell to attend.

For adults in school, they too can attend work when well enough to do so, or if they take a Covid test and are positive, they should isolate for 5 days.

School staff no longer test for Covid19 and the school does not a have a supply of tests any longer. We are hopeful that the guidance will mean better school attendance for all as we learn to live with Covid19.

We are looking forward to welcoming parents into school again this term for our face to face parent's meetings where we can share your child's progress and you can see the work they have been doing. We are also looking forward to welcoming you to coffee mornings after half term where we hope Mrs Clement will be able to join us - see the Diary Dates for details.
