
# Pyrford C of E Primary School Weekly Newsletter

#### Headteacher's Letter

Good morning, we have made it to half term! This week we have enjoyed a relatively drama-free week (I do hope I'm not speaking too soon), but this half term has certainly been like no other. I wanted to publicly thank the staff at the school who have had to adapt all of their working practices. They have constantly had to learn new systems, routines and technologies against a backdrop of ever-changing guidance, whilst trying to juggle the challenges of home life themselves during this pandemic. I am grateful to staff for their commitment to completely rewriting curriculum plans for every single lesson. Teaching is our bread and butter and is our craft for which we have trained long and hard. What we never anticipated were the challenges of trying to teach a class of mixed-ability children with some in school and some at home. Nevertheless, we have tried hard and as this pandemic continues, I am sure we will continue to improve and re-evaluate our teaching and learning.

My thanks also to parents for their understanding and support of the school. One of our biggest challenges has been parental communication. We really do miss being able to have a short conversation with you at the school door and we are trying to work our way around this as best we can. I have to say though that those of you who are new to our school have done amazingly well, particularly the children in Reception classes who have taken to school like ducks to water.

Going into the winter months, when the weather is colder, we are keen to review our school drop off to make it as seamless as possible whilst maintaining social distancing and avoiding bubble mixing etc. From 3rd November, we would like to try the following.

Year Groups	School start time (drop off from 10 minutes before please)	Procedure in the morning
1 & 2	8:30 am	Straight in (no need to line up)
3 & 4	8:40 am	Straight in (no need to line up)
5 & 6	8:50 am	There may be some lining up required. If everyone else is on time, then children will be able to go straight in.

Mrs Murray will write to parents in Reception about their drop off / start times.

Please note the times in the table above are teaching start times. Teachers are in classrooms with work ready to go so we are very keen for children to be in on time. We open gates 10 minutes before the start time to allow for the flow of children. We will try our best not to keep parents and children waiting in the cold. Unfortunately, we just can't find a way of making pick up any easier due to safeguarding requirements, so arrangements will need to remain as they are, although we have this running fairly slickly now.

Whilst I am talking about drop off and pick up, can I remind parents of the need to be respectful to the school's neighbours. I had a very irate neighbour who was most unhappy about the fact that a parent had blocked their driveway and then when asked to move, they were verbally abusive. This behaviour is not acceptable, particularly in front of our school children. It would help my workload greatly if parents could remember this.

On to happier events, Year 5 had a fabulous planetarium visit at the school this

week to support their learning and today Year 3 are looking fabulous in their Roman and Celt costumes as they prepare to 'battle' as part of their learning in history. Thank you as always to parents for providing costumes.

This year, under government guidance, we are unable to do school tours for prospective parents so we have been busy putting together video clips to post on our website due for release after half term. Do have a look yourselves if you get the chance as there are some fabulous photos of your children which show what we get up to behind the closed doors here at Pyrford. I am sure that after the lockdown period this year, you must think we complete worksheets every minute of every day, but I can assure you that we don't. So please do take a look.



I hope you have an enjoyable half-term or at least get off the school run treadmill! We look forward to welcoming children back on Tuesday 3rd November


