Headteacher's Letter

Good morning. It is lovely to have everyone back!

This week Year 2 joined us again on Tuesday and Year 4 on Thursday. It is always lovely to have a full school which is buzzing with children and adults. My huge thanks to parents for your understanding during this extremely challenging time. Having spoken to many of you personally, all of you who have different home demands and situations, I think you've done a great job of supporting your children as best as you can. Unfortunately, it looks like bubble closure is becoming more of the norm for us all now as cases continue to rise. A few have asked again about a circuit breaker two week half term which Northern Ireland have now implemented. I attend national meetings on a regular basis with leaders who meet directly with ministers and, at the time of writing, this has still not been put on the table for schools in England, but decisions seem to move at pace within Government. I will keep you posted should I get any confirmation that the situation is changing. We are expecting to have half term from Monday 26 October-Friday 30 October and in addition to this, there is a planned INSET day for Monday 2 November. Pupils should return to school on Tuesday 3 November.

Children in different year groups have enjoyed the Perform drama workshops which we held this week. There was great enjoyment as the different aged children (YN-Y3) participated in the fun, Covid secure socially distanced workshops. Year 4 also had a welcome return yesterday with their Saxon's day activities.

As we head towards the second half of term, we are thinking about our Christmas activities. Obviously we are bound by government guidelines around Covid but we are determined to give the children something to look forward to. We are currently getting our heads around what we can do to make Christmas time special in school. I may be coming back to you for some fundraising ideas to help us fund some of our planned activities. As you can imagine, the school is hugely impacted in respect of available funding due to loss of income for lettings and our childcare is, like all businesses in the current situation, faced with increasing costs.

We have had our DfE allocation of 9 devices sent this week and have now set these up ready for use both in school and as loan items should they be required for any isolating children who do not have access. Hopefully these, coupled with the large purchase of chrome books which the school and PTA are funding, will provide much-needed technology both within the school and at home. I appreciate it was very tricky last week for parents who had children in both years 2 and 4 home learning at the same time and both requiring devices to access and complete work.

Finally, thank you for your generous harvest donations last week. The majority of this food has gone to the Woking food bank and some has been distributed within our school community. Your donations are appreciated.

At the end of this half term, we will have completed our gap analysis of every child's learning. Teachers have already been adapting curriculum planning and have built in re-cap and reflection sessions into lessons. Children have been increasing their stamina for learning in the classroom during this half term and teachers have focussed particularly on stamina for writing, which was identified as an issue across the entire school. It is an intense day for all the children and adults in school so a break will be welcomed I'm sure. Teachers will feedback to every parent about their child via video conferencing. We will send out details nearer the time.


