Headteacher's Letter

As we come to the end of a packed term with the many challenges that have been thrown our way, it is time to celebrate all that has been achieved as a school community. We have been able to have some sense of normality in our school this past term with a return to trips and visits and of course all of our recent and upcoming Christmas celebrations. It was great to see so many of you at the Christmas Tree Sale and Fayre on Saturday; we are now well on our way to being able to pay for the huge book and phonics order we are planning to make over the next couple of weeks.

A highlight for Mrs Little and myself each week is hosting our Golden Book Assemblies on Zoom. It is wonderful to celebrate the achievements of individual and groups of children.
