

# Headteacher's Letter

Good morning and welcome to the end of our second full week back.

As always we have thrown ourselves into our work and are beavering away. We are currently trying to arrange as many different learning experiences for the children as we can for the remainder of the summer term, as well as looking at plans for next year. We are very keen to drive music, sport and creative arts as part of our curriculum offer in 21/22.

The PTA met this week to discuss ideas of how we can fundraise to support our plans for next year, so you will be hearing about fundraising ideas as well as opportunities for our school community to come together again.

Many thanks to parents who have booked parent consultation meetings. We have had a great take-up so far but if you are struggling to book and need any help, please ring Mrs Little at school and she will readily help you. Teachers are looking forward to meeting with you to discuss your child.

It has been brought to my attention that we need to think about the queuing system in the morning at Coldharbour Road. We put in staggered drop-off times for different year groups so that we would avoid overcrowding and safe covid procedures could be adhered to. However, I fully understand that if you are a parent with children in different year groups, staggered drop-off is not convenient at all and so we introduced the safe drop off in the playground. The issue we have at the moment is that everyone seems to arrive at 8.30am and the large numbers of children and parents queueing at Coldharbour are causing others to step into the road to drop off bikes, scooters etc. There is a real concern (and has been witnessed) that a car/lorry will speed along the road and hit a child or parent who has had to step onto the roads due to crowding. I would hate this to happen. Can I encourage you to snake the queue into the staff carpark on the pathway by the barrier which then runs parallel to the green playground fence. This will then mean fewer children and adults are on the pavement. We are working with our local County Councillor, Liz Bowes who has commissioned a traffic survey along the Coldharbour Road and is investigating traffic calming measures in the locality. Please help us to help you.

This weekend is Bank holiday weekend, so no school on Monday! I hope you enjoy spending time together and look forward to welcoming everyone back on Tuesday.
