Headteacher's Letter

Good morning. I promise this newsletter issue won't be the bumper issue that we sent out at the end of last half term. However, there is always so much going on and we like to share what we've been up to in the week.

I hope you all had an enjoyable bank holiday and enjoyed the many Jubilee celebrations which took place. I braved a trip to London and whilst it was beyond busy, it felt great to experience normality again and to see people out and about enjoying themselves

We have come back to school facing the challenge of Processionary Oak Moth infestation <u>https://www.gov.uk/guidance/managing-oak-processionary-mothin-england#what-to-do-if-exposed</u> in a number of trees both on the school site, among neighbours and on the cricket field. Processional Oak moth can cause harm to humans, so you will note that some areas of the school grounds have either had to be cordoned off or closed completely. We are having to change plans for events which involve using the outdoor areas. At this stage, we are still intending to run sports days and will rope off a section of the school field so that everyone is kept safe. We are working with tree specialists and the Forestry Commission and will be guided by their expertise in carrying out our risk assessments. Please be mindful of young children and animals near the school site and on public footpaths where signage has been put up to alert you of the moths.

On the theme of bugs, our Reception and Nursery children had a visit by a number of minibeasts this week. The children were keen to learn about all of the bugs which were shown to them.

Year 2 have been out on a science visit this week at the Look Out Discovery Centre, where they were actively engaged in a number of science activities as well as enjoying a picnic and the play area there.

A number of our young writers travelled to a local school to participate in a writing workshop, spending the day with an author of science fiction.

Finally, please see overleaf for the list of classes and teachers for next year. We are keen that children know what is happening so that we can best prepare them for transition. We are looking forward to welcoming Miss Dennis as a teacher in Year 2. She has just finished her SCITT training and was on placement with us in Year 1 earlier this year.

Can I also remind you to keep a close eye on the dates section (on the left of this page) as there is so much going on during this last half term. We will keep updating this weekly.


