Good morning, what a cold start to the day!

This half term is flying by, I can't quite believe that we are heading towards the end of January.

Of course, much of the week has again been dominated by the covid cases in school. There has been a domino effect following last weekend and we have had over 50 cases this week alone. Please be vigilant and get your children tested. In schools an 'outbreak' is used to describe when there are 5 or more cases in a class. In our school this currently includes the following classes:

Holly
Alder
Larch
Maple
Cedar

If your child is in one of these classes they are treated as a close contact and should test for 7 days using LFT. Luckily, we are not hearing of children being too unwell with covid. Guidance now allows anyone who has tested positive to return to school on day 6 if they have tested negative on LFT on days 5 and 6. Tests must be taken 24 hours apart. For clarification, day 1 is classed as the first full day after confirmation of a positive case.

For example:

Saturday - test positive on LFT or PCE (if symptomatic) - this is day ZERO

Sunday - Day 1

Monday - Day 2

Tuesday - Day 3

Wednesday - Day 4

Thursday early morning - Day 5. Take LFT. If positive, continue to isolate and test tomorrow; if negative, continue to isolate, take test on Day 6.

Friday early morning - Day 6. Take LFT. If positive, continue to isolate and test tomorrow; if negative, return to school.

All children are expected to return to school after 10 days. Hopefully children will not be off any longer.

We are all excited for Monday when our year 6 football team will be playing in the County finals. Thank you to Mr Burnett and Mrs Cockle for giving up their time to come and train the team. We are super proud of them and wish them luck. We'll send an update next week.

Next week we will be joined by our school improvement partner who is visiting the school to see how we are getting on with our school focussed priorities, identifying areas of strength and areas for development.

I am hopeful that children and staff will return next week so that we can continue with the planned curriculum, trips and visits.

Grassland Biomes

Tropical
These grasslands have a wet season and a dry season. The range of temperatures throughout the year is smaller than temperate grasslands. Savannas in agriculture, especially tropical grasslands.

Temperate
These have hot summers and cold winters. Summer temperatures can be well over 100 degrees Fahrenheit, while winter can be as low as -10.

What is a grassland biome?
Grasslands are areas where a variety of grasses grow. There are not many other trees or plants apart from trees near water sources. The grasslands are very hot places in summer. Some become really cold in winter. Grasslands are found across the world and are known by different names in different places!
