



### Headteacher's Letter

Good morning and welcome to the end of the penultimate week before the half term holiday. I'm not sure where exactly this half term has gone, especially when there is still so much to do and going on!

This week started with us sharing collective worship focussed around the Queen's upcoming Platinum Jubilee. Children were engaging in conversation and information about the Queen's 70 year reign, so don't be surprised if they ask you what events are taking place locally and in London over the next couple of weeks.

In celebration of the jubilee, children are learning about the different decades of the Queen's reign, decorating the school with bunting and taking part in school competitions. On Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> May, we are inviting all children to come to school dressed in red, white and blue. Children will take part in our school event sharing dance moves and a tea party during the afternoon. All children will eat lunch in school as normal, but we are encouraging children to bring in a small picnic/snacks for the afternoon session. We leave the choice of snack to you, but please ask that it **doesn't contain nuts** due to the number of children and staff with severe nut allergies. Children may bring something to share with a small group of friends should they wish. If your child has specific allergies we would suggest making sure that your child eats their own food only and that they are fully aware of their allergies - encourage them to ask an adult if they are unsure. We will do our absolute best and put safeguards in place to ensure that children with allergies have their needs met, but it can be difficult having eyes on all 500 children at once! Children with allergies will be given the usual orange wrist band to wear during the picnic so that they are identifiable to staff. Food should be brought in a bag/ lunch box and will be stored in the classrooms during the day, so please don't send anything which needs chilling or freezing. We would also like to encourage children to bring a towel or small mat to sit on - fingers crossed it will be a dry day otherwise we will be reverting to our plan B based indoors. If the weather is hot, as always please ensure you put sun cream on your child before school and send in a sun hat.

This Wednesday we were visited by the Tropical Zoo. Children in year 4 had a great time learning about the different species as well as handling some of them. I certainly kept my distance when the snakes came out! The children loved the visit and this has really enhanced their knowledge and skills learning, linked to the geography and science curriculum.

The PTA met this week to plan events for the coming months. Our next whole school community event will be an end of term celebration on Friday 15th July after school and into the evening (please note term doesn't finish on this date!) More details to follow soon.

As I have said, next week is the last week before the half term. We have a visit from our School Improvement Partner who is coming to look at the quality of our curriculum which is planned and delivered in the school. We also have the Year 3 and 4 production to look forward to and Year 5 have a day planned doing bushcraft.

Here's to another busy week to look forward to.







### COOKERY CLUB

Some very enthusiastic chefs this week and it certainly looks like fun was had by all. Here's the recipe so you can try this tasty treat at home.

### DATE ENERGY BALLS

1/2 CUP OATS (64g)
1/2 CUP SHREDDED COCONUT unsweetened (64g)
1/4 CUP COCOA POWDER (32g)
1 TABLESPOON MAPLE SYRUP
16 DATES
2 TABLE SPOONS SUNFLOWER SEEDS
1/2 CUP FINELY CHOPPED PRETZELS (64g)







### Instructions

Place oats and coconut into food processor and pulse until finely ground.

Add cocoa powder, dates, sunflower seeds and maple syrup and pulse to combine until the mixture comes together in a sort of dough. Add a few more drops of maple syrup if it's not quite coming togeth-

Roll mixture into 2.5cm balls and roll in the chopped pretzels **Notes:** store in an airtight container at room temperature for 5-7 days.


