Headteacher's Letter

Good morning and welcome to what has been a short week!

Children in school are excited today to be attending the Young Voices concert at the O2 Arena this evening. It is so lovely to be hearing the children sing in school and for them to now perform with thousands of other children from around the country. I know it will be a very late night but hopefully one to add to the memory bank.

Our Reception classes are heading out to Godstone Farm today too. There is great excitement in school this morning, mainly asking when it will be lunchtime! Please keep an eye out in next week's newsletter for some photographs of how the visit went, I'm sure they'll have a wonderful day and everyone will sleep well tonight!

I am very pleased to share with you that we are getting ready to welcome our first. Ukrainian children to the school. I am sure that the children and yourselves will make the families feel welcome in our school community as we strive to provide safety and security for these children.

In school we are busy planning for the Jubilee celebrations - as a heads up we will be having a whole school event on Thursday 26th May where children will be invited to wear red, white and blue to school. Children will be studying the different decades of Queen Elizabeth's reign and will be learning songs associated with that time period. We will also be decorating the school with bunting and holding various creative workshops and competitions. This is a great opportunity to be together as a whole school community for the celebrations.

The local authority has asked me to share with you information regarding the rise in scarlet fever cases which is being seen across the country. The information below provides you with details.

Signs and symptoms of scarlet fever

Scarlet fever is a common childhood infection caused by Streptococcus pyogenes, or group A streptococcus (GAS). The early symptoms of scarlet fever include sore throat, headache, fever, nausea, and vomiting. After 12 to 48 hours the characteristic red, pinhead rash develops, typically first appearing on the chest and stomach, then rapidly spreading to other parts of the body, and giving the skin a sandpaper-like texture. The scarlet rash may be harder to spot on darker skin, although the 'sandpaper' feel should be present. Patients typically have flushed cheeks and pallor around the mouth. This may be accompanied by a 'strawberry tongue'. As the child improves peeling of the skin can occur.

The school will, as always work with health protection teams (UKHSA) and follow infection control guidance. Please inform the school immediately should your child be diagnosed with this. We have also been advised of a rise in chicken pox cases in years R and 1 across Surrey.

Please can I remind parents to adequately supervise their children and siblings during the pickup period at the end of the day. We are investigating additional fencing near the environmental area which is close to the nursery pick up. Please be aware that there is a pond in the environmental area and small children have been found there unattended after school. We are

obviously keen to keep everybody in our school community safe, so would appreciate your support in supervising your own children.

Next week we will be resuming SATs testing for children in years two and six. This is a national requirement which is governed by the DfE. It is imperative that all pupils are in school and on time as there is a strict timetable that the school must follow. If your child in year six or two is unwell, please ring us at the earliest convenience so that a timetable variation may be applied for by the school. We are keen to make these tests as stress free as possible for the children. The children have worked really hard this year across the school and deserve to do well. Please make sure children are well rested, fed and watered! If you have any concerns or issues, please do not hesitate to contact a member of the team so that we can help you. I know that the children are certainly looking forward to celebrating at the end of the week after all their hard work.

Finally, I would like to wish you a good weekend.














Clubs


