Headteacher's Letter

Good morning. It now seems like we've been back together at school forever. The children remain engaged in learning and seem very happy to see their friends and teachers every day. Hopefully you are all benefitting from the routine in your lives. We will see if everyone is just as tired by the end of today as they were by the end of last Friday.

In classrooms, the pace of learning has picked up and children are getting used to the expectations we have in school. Writing is probably the hardest nut to crack. With children having been used to using technology so much for learning, we are encouraging them to write at length in school and we are starting to see real improvements in content, amount and presentation.

As I mentioned last week, we are looking forwards and have been able to put together a swimming programme for the summer term. Thank you to those of you who responded to our google poll about offering additional swimming lessons after school. All children in Yrs R-3 will swim during various slots in the school day and we will also be offering private swimming lessons after school. We will write to you with full details shortly. I am sure you can imagine, due to the pandemic and social distancing and covid protection measures, the swimming requires extensive planning.

Next week all children will take part in our formative assessment, this is nothing to worry about and is part of our usual processes in school. This gives teachers the opportunity to identify any specific learning gaps for individuals or groups and then enables them to plan lessons to meet those needs as we move into the summer term. We will hold meetings with all parents during the third week of the summer term. These will be held virtually again and will give you the opportunity to discuss your child's return to school, progress made and general well-being. Again, information will be sent to you separately so that you can book an appointment.

Each week in school we like to focus on something to celebrate and this week our kitchen staff have come up trumps again! Our cook, Vanessa decorated the school kitchen with a St Patrick's Day theme and the team made some fabulous cupcakes with lucky golden coins. These went down a storm with the children!

As a reminder, if you wish to participate in LFD non-symptomatic covid testing, you are welcome to get tests for all the adults in your household from Park View Sheerwater between 1pm and 8pm daily.

I can't quite believe that we are almost at the end of the Spring term. I am sure some of you are certainly ready for a break whilst others aren't feeling quite the same about having the children back at home over the holidays! The good news is that restrictions are starting to lift over the school break. I do hope you can enjoy these once again found freedoms. As a reminder, these include:

From 29 March:

- * People will be allowed to meet outside, either with one other household or within the "rule of six", including in private gardens
- The stay at home rule will end, but the government will urge people to stay local as much as possible
- * Outdoor sport facilities will reopen, including golf courses and tennis and basketball courts, and formally organised outdoor sports can restart

* Weddings attended by up to six people can take place in any circumstances

Stage two (no earlier than 12 April):

- * All shops allowed to open, along with close-contact services, including hairdressers and beauty salons (including in people's homes)
- Restaurants and pubs allowed to serve food and alcohol to customers sitting outdoors
- * Gyms and spas can reopen, as can zoos, theme parks, libraries and community centres
- Members of the same household can take a holiday in the UK in selfcontained accommodation
- * Weddings attended by up to 15 people can take place

School will close to pupils on Thursday 1st April (see pick up times in the table below). I will be contactable for any positive covid cases during this time. DfE have requested that schools remain in control of the track and trace procedures for the first 6 days of the break. Therefore if children or staff members test positive for covid19 any time from Thursday 1st April – Tuesday 6th April, please contact me via email on <u>head@pyrford.surrey.sch.uk</u> If your child tests positive outside of these dates, NHS track and trace will support and advise you. Staff will continue to carry out lateral flow testing during the entire Easter break.

Developing Positive Behaviour through Emotion coaching: An approach for parents and carers to use with children and

young people (aged 3-18 years).



Sound familiar?

Tim, 4, has made it clear he doesn't want to get ready for bed and his loud screams wake up his baby sister.

Marta, 9, refuses to get up out of bed and prepare for school in the morning. When her Dad pulls off the covers, she hurts him.

Sam, 15, won't stop playing on the iPad. He promised his sister he would share it with her, and so a loud argument starts. Someone gets hurt.

Emotion coaching is an approach which helps children and young people to understand the different emotions they experience, why they occur and how to handle them. This helps children and young people to learn how to regulate their emotions and behaviour.



- Emotion coaching training is a <u>free, online course</u> for <u>parents and carers</u>.
- There are two training options to choose from:

Option A: Introductory Course: An introduction to emotion coaching, including a 1.5 hour training and a drop-in Q&A session: 19th May 2021 and time/date TBC.

Option B: Applied Course: A more in-depth look at what emotion coaching is and how to use it effectively with your child, including 5x 1.5 hour sessions with a mix of training, reflection and discussion. Course dates: 6th, 13th, 20th, 27th May and 10th June 2021.
