



Headteacher's Letter

Good morning, we've had a great week in school with so much going on. Thanks to parents for going with the flow with all the changing arrangements we seem to have at the moment.

Despite the deluge of rain on Monday, Year 6 had a great time completing team challenge activities outside. It was lovely to see the children taking part this week in activities which we would normally do on a residential visit. Mrs Little and I popped along to the bushcraft activities in the environmental area where children were busy filtering water, cooking on the campfire and attempting to build waterproof shelters. A great day was had by all!

Year 6 children had a super service in the church to remember their primary school years. In normal times, we attend a service at Guildford Cathedral. However, this wasn't possible this year, so the team over at COGs very kindly put together a very personalised event just for our children. It was lovely for the children to take part in different reflection and prayer activities, as well as a short service with popular action songs. Our thanks to our church team for giving up their time to make a memorable 'Covid safe' experience for our children.

Year 4 have also had an exciting week; taking part in team-building exercises as well as a whole focus on sports this week. However, the highlight for most of the children so far has been the awarding of the Blue Peter badges! Each child (and staff member!) has been awarded the Blue Peter Eco badge (see page 7). I'm not sure who exactly was more excited; the children or the staff? (many have had a secret hankering for years to be a Blue Peter badge holder!)

Our Early Years and Key Stage 1 children participated in their sports day on Wednesday. It was another great event which was superbly well organised by Mrs Steen and Mrs Cockle. The event ran like clockwork and the children showed true sportsmanship. Hopefully, in the future, we'll be able to have spectators- although no tears this year when parents would have to leave at the end which children find upsetting. We have now pulled together final event scores for our KS2 children and yesterday house cups, medals and certificates were awarded to our winners and nominated sports stars (see pages 9 - 11).

Nigel, our photographer has been in school taking class photographs - we are busy praying for dry days as every available space inside is being used. My thanks to parents who we've contacted to change photograph days. There has been so much going on, it is a logistical nightmare getting everyone in one place, wearing the same clothes for a photo. I'm sure this will all ease once restrictions are hopefully lifted.

As I wrote last week, we are busy planning for next year. At the end of term I will send a letter with full details regarding September, but as a heads up for those of you planning childcare, we have decided to keep our slightly staggered start and finish times with the same drop-off and pick up procedures we have in place now.

We appreciate that you would like to drop siblings together, so as is the case now, children may line up until their cohort goes in. Please note, classwork starts promptly, so children should arrive on time. The gates will be closed very promptly. Late arrivals should report to the school office so that they can be added to the attendance registers. For parents having to pick up siblings in YR, Y1 and Y2 we

understand this is slightly trickier. Please choose whichever pick up works best for you and we will hold on to any siblings until you can get round to collect.

We are keen that children get as much learning time as possible and our staggered start and finish times this past year has allowed us more learning time in the classroom which we are keen to keep. We have narrowed the stagger slightly and will review it if it proves too narrow a window.

We had a long discussion about drop off and pick up and we believe that the system we currently have maximises safeguarding and many of you report that traffic is so much better. However, one thing which teachers say is more difficult is the time to get to know parents so well. We are therefore going to introduce a termly coffee morning/afternoon where parents and staff can meet in year groups so that parents can have a social gathering with peers and get to know staff working with your children in a less formal manner. Again, watch this space - these great plans are all guidance dependent.

Thinking about next year, we have lined up a great clubs offer with a huge variety for families to choose from should they wish. We are currently firming up details, timetabling etc and will get details to you as soon as it is finalised and again once restrictions are lifted. Just a reminder that the term dates are on the website and on page 12 of this newsletter, but for those of you planning holidays etc, please note that there are 2 INSET days in September - Wednesday 1st September and Thursday 2nd September. School will start for Years 1-6 on Friday 3rd September 2021.

Next week, children will have the opportunity to meet their new teacher. Again, a little bit of a logistical nightmare with Covid restrictions and the changes to plans for Year 6 and EYFS visiting new settings. However, we have planned for current YR -Y5 to visit their new classes in school on Tuesday 29th June. Year 6 parents should have been contacted by their secondary schools about arrangements as these have changed from planned Surrey wide transition. Please note, schools have had to do different things in line with their Covid risk assessments and personal school circumstances.

Over the weekend, we have a team of IT engineers working in school to install new servers and to migrate our systems as part of our IT infrastructure overhaul. This means that staff have had to surrender all IT equipment for the weekend and they will not have access to remote working. Please can I ask you to hold any emails

until Monday lunchtime if possible when we should be fully up and running. As you can imagine, there is slight panic from the workaholics amongst us who are attached to our devices! Fingers crossed all will run smoothly and the IT engineer team will be onsite on Monday to ensure we have successfully joined the modern world! I, meanwhile, am now going to have to finally face tidying the garage at chez Krynicki, my 'I need to do school work' excuse is not going to work with Mr K!
