Job Advertisement for Charity Executive Role at Let's Read



Let's Read is a charity based in Woking which helps children in primary schools improve their literacy, particularly those who struggle with reading. We are recruiting a part-time paid Charity Executive who will be responsible for the day-to-day running of the charity and the provision of services to support its two programmes in Woking primary schools:

- one-to-one tuition with teams of volunteer tutors going into four schools over two mornings a week,
- the presentation of nearly 600 books each term to year-2 children in eleven schools.

The workload is assessed to be two days a week during term time plus other days and the occasional evening, with availability to attend schools on Tuesday and/or Thursday mornings an advantage. The role includes secretary to the Board of Trustees/Directors. The Charity Executive is accountable to the chair of the Charity. Payment level and arrangements depend on the successful applicant. The candidate will have:

- A strong desire to help young people improve their literacy skills
- Good administrative, office IT and social media skills
- A background in teaching, education, business or charity work
- A good understanding of charity governance
- A personable and enthusiastic nature
- Effective leadership qualities, particularly inspiring volunteers
- Experience of fund raising

The position will commence from July 2022 in preparation for the new Autumn term and is an excellent opportunity to make a positive difference to the lives of young people.
