WHAT YOU SAID

The school keeps me well informed regarding my child's progress - 76% My child is making the progress I expect to see - 77% Homework is not used appropriately and is therefore hindering progress



- We have 2 in person parents' evenings a year.

- Whilst evidence shows that homework has limited impact on children's progress, we will review our homework policy and ensure that what is sent home is in line with the needs and abilities of the individual child.
