6 HOLLY



Year 5 visit the Mosque

On Tuesday, Year 5 went to the Shah Jahan Mosque because in RE we are learning about Islam. We were greeted by a person called Habib who told us lots of interesting facts about the mosque and Islam.

I learned that the Shah Jahan Mosque was built in 1889 by a Jewish person called Gottlieb Wilhelm Leitner who was from Budapest. It was designed by a Christian architect from Guildford called W. L. Chambers.

We also talked about The Five Pillars of Islam which are Shadah which means faith, the 2nd pillar is Salah which means doing your prayers 5 times a day facing the Qibla, the 3rd one is Zakkah which means giving 2.5 percent of your money to charity, the 4th one is Saum which means fasting for 30 days because it reminds Muslims not to waste food and finally, the last pillar is Hajj (a pilgrimage to Mecca) which you have to do at least once in your life time.

We finished our visit by going inside the mosque which is the oldest in all of Northern Europe. Amazingly, it is 134 years old and still looks beautiful today!

Teach your child energy saving habits

As your child grows, teach them some habits to save energy around the home:

- Switch off the lights when they leave the room
- Turn off the tap when they're not using it. For example, when brushing teeth, or washing hands.
- Put on a jumper and thick socks instead of turning the heating on.
- Ask them to close the door behind them when they come inside.
- Switch off the TV and any consoles when they're not using them. Use the 'shut down' function on your computers and laptops.
- Turn off or unplug electrical items when finished with them. Some devices use energy even when they aren't on, eg kettle, phone chargers, lamps and fans.

We offer a range of regular play group activities as well as sensory and art and craft activities.


We also often have visiting professionals on-hand to answer any questions that you may have about
