# New from The Inclusion Team this year

We have successfully introduced provision for children who require a more bespoke approach at the start of the day and at lunchtime. 'Morning Club' and 'Lunch Club' are run by Mrs Leahy and Mrs Phelan and are offered to children identified as needing this additional support.

You may have seen our beautifully decorated 'Buddy Benches' on the playgrounds. These are a great way for children to communicate to others that they need some support. Children are encouraged to use the benches themselves and to look out for their peers who may need a helping hand.

We have continued to work closely with colleagues in a wide range of sectors including social care, health and our local family centre.
