PSHE

Hello! We are Lizzie Wright and Sarah Bourne and we are jointly responsible for PSHE, which stands for Personal, Health and Economic Education at Pyrford - a subject that we both feel passionately about. PSHE is very much about life skills and equipping our children for

the world - it is strongly linked to our school values and it permeates everything that we do in school.



Each half term covers a different theme. These themes are;

Our PSHE lessons are based on a scheme called SCARF, produced by Coram Life Education

- * Me and My Relationships
- * Keeping Safe
- * Being my Best

- * Valuing Difference
- * Rights and Respect
- * Growing and Changing

As a subject, PSHE covers the topics of feelings, friendships, families as well as exploring differences between people. The children learn about keeping themselves safe, including road safety and bikeability, as well as online safety. The subject has strong links to the science curriculum and focuses on healthy eating, healthy lifestyles and hygiene. The children also learn important first aid skills as well as how to manage money. As the children mature, themes such as drugs (including medicine and alcohol), prejudice, discrimination and stereotypes are explored in class.

Underpinning everything we do is the key message of 'safeguarding'- ensuring that children understand that their body belongs to them and that they should report anything that upsets them to a trusted adult. We work closely with the Inclusion Team in school to support pupils' wellbeing.

Sarah Bourne - We also have separate areas of responsibility within the subject. Having spent most of my teaching



career in Years 5&6, I am responsible for RSE (relationships and sex education), which is delivered as part of a wider science topic during the summer term of Year 5.

Lizzie Wright - We have a keen team of children from Years 3-6 who represent the school as our Wellbeing Ambassadors. I lead this team, with the help of Mrs Leahy, and the children have organised and led activities during the mental health weeks. They have also helped to further develop the wellbeing of all our children during lunch and playtimes.

Linked to PSHE, some of the events and

actions that we have taken in school are:

- NSPCC assemblies and a safeguarding workshop for Years 5&6.
- Fantastic Fred workshop- focusing on mental health strategies.
- The Life Space has visited each class to address different aspects of PSHE.
- We have celebrated Mental Health week, Autism Acceptance week, Black History month and Safer Internet Day in school.
- Books promoting mental health, equality, diversity and inclusivity are embedded in our English texts- through lessons as well as those read during story time.
- Achievements are celebrated weekly, through the Golden Book assembly, as well as termly ceremonies to recognise achievement, effort and those children who have demonstrated resilience, love, respect and wisdom.
