Safer Internet Day - 7th February 2023


Want to talk about it? Making space for conversations about life online

5 WILLOW




6 HOLLY

A message from NEU members

This week we took the difficult decision to not take part in strike action as we understand the disruption to parents is huge. We would, however, just like to take this opportunity to express our support for the strike action that did take place this week.

Pay for experienced teachers has fallen by one fifth in real terms since 2010. And now Britain is facing the worst cost-of-living crisis in a generation.

The government is suggesting experienced teachers' pay should only go up by five per cent this year, however some of this money has to come out of the existing school budget. It is not fully funded by the government.

The union advises that long hours and poor pay are the main reasons teachers are leaving the profession in their droves. This government is presiding over one of the worst recruitment and retention crises ever seen in education.

The government says there isn't enough money to pay teachers an inflation proofed pay rise. The Union believes there is money available to the government to solve this dispute and to protect education.


