Hi – I'm Angie Bull and as well as being a Class Teacher in Year 6, I am the subject lead for both Art and Design and Design and Technology. I feel strongly that the children should be given every opportunity to express themselves in artistic ways - it helps them to develop a natural sense of wonder and curiosity about the world around them and links strongly to our school values.

Art and Design

This is a wonderful subject to lead as art fosters creativity, imagination and confidence: skills that are used in every other subject in school, and which are indispensable throughout life. We hope to inspire pupils by looking at a variety of artists as inspiration for their own ideas - it is so lovely to enjoy their finished creations which are displayed around the school.

We teach Art and Design in four basic strands:

- ◆ Drawing – from initial mark-making, through exploring shapes, creating landscapes, studying how to create shade, pattern and perspective including reproducing realistic details in portraits.
- ◆ Painting – discovering how to apply paint with a variety of tools, learning about colour wheels, creating texture and effects, exploring complementary colours, matching mood with colour and finding out what is a composition.
- ◆ Printing – starting with using everyday object to print, making rubbings, exploring natural materials to print with, using collagraph techniques and progressing to silk screen printing.
- ◆ Sculpture – creating structures with small world objects, forest sculptures out of natural materials, clay sculptures and using paper/cardboard 3D models.



Our Art and Design projects and masterpieces are also celebrated in the community; on show at the Guildford Cathedral Christmas Art Exhibition, and at our own Summer Pyrford Village Show, where all the children have the chance to show off their own artistic flair in the huge marquee.

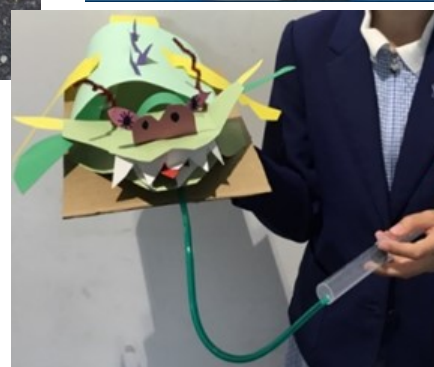


Design and Technology

Designing their own ideas, after researching a real-life problem to solve, means that the children get to explore, design and create products both independently and in a group. I love it when excited faces appear at my door, eager to show their work and I am always impressed with their imagination and ingenuity.

We teach Design and Technology in the following strands:

- ◆ Food and Nutrition – studied by every year group
- ◆ Textiles – making puppets, cushions and slippers
- ◆ Structures – creating packaging, a kite, robots and vehicles
- ◆ Mechanisms – designing moving pictures, lighthouse pulleys, moving skeletons, pneumatic dragons and CAMs toys
- ◆ Electrical Circuits – electric vehicles and robots

In Art and Design we learn about famous artists, art skills and how to express ourselves creatively.

Anyone can draw – anyone can do art.

In Design and Technology, we design and make products that solve real problems.



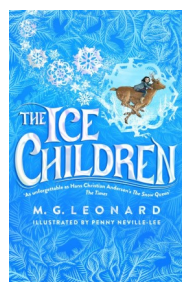
