

Busy Year 5 & Year 1 Modern Artists



Dear Parents and Carers,

We are very sad to announce the death of Roy Davey who was, for many years, both the Chair of our Local Governing Body and also of the then, Newark Academy Trust, until he moved away from the area in 2016.

Pyrford ran strongly through Roy's blood and he was passionate, in particular, about the education of Pyrford's children. He was responsible for bringing the community infant and junior schools together to form Pyrford Primary and then for pushing for our change of status to a Church of England school in 2000 and then an Academy in 2014. I believe he had been born here, but certainly he lived here as a boy and stayed in the area until his retirement. He was an educationalist through and through and was Headteacher of a local secondary school before becoming Director of Education in the Oxford Diocese.

He was also a stalwart member of the church and the Pyrford Community and was Chairman of the Pyrford and Wisley Flower Show for many years. Some of you may remember him standing in Coldharbour Road in his high viz waistcoat, marshalling the traffic on the morning of the show.

We remember him fondly and his ashes will be returned to his beloved Pyrford where they will be interred alongside those of his late wife, Jane, in St Nicholas graveyard.
