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Headteacher's Letter

Dear Parents,

We've had another successful week at Pyrford and it has been lovely to have some sunshine! The children are settling into their new routines well and are engaging in their learning. It has been a pleasure to see so many 'Wow' moments in the classroom already this term.

This week, we continued our exploration of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, focusing on the message that we shouldn't worry because God will always care for us. We also discussed how it's completely normal to feel worried at times, and how important it is to share those worries with trusted adults and family members who can help. We talked about how some things are not for children to worry about, and how adults, with their life experience, can offer guidance, as they may have faced similar concerns in the past. It's essential that parents and adults, are mindful of what is discussed around children, or what they may be exposed to online as certain conversations can lead to unnecessary worries. At the same time, it's important to shield children from the things that concern us as adults, whenever possible.

This week saw our Dodgeball team head to Woking Leisure Centre to compete against a number of other local schools. They came second and I'm very proud of how they represented the school with pride, demonstrating our school values and being excellent ambassadors for our school. Well done to them!

Before I finish off this communication I do have a few requests:

- 1) I understand that with the end of the road closed it does make it harder to move around the school at drop off and pick up times. However, this is no excuse for poor, disrespectful or illegal parking. Please make sure you do not block driveways or paths and think about where you are parking so that all our children can be safe.
- 2) Trading cards, whether they be football cards or Pokémon or anything similar, are not allowed on the school site. We have had a number of incidents this week that have disrupted the school's core purpose of learning. We do not allow other 'toys' to be brought into school and I have instructed staff that if they are brought to school, we will remove them from the children, until the end of the day. Please help us, by

ensuring that these and other unnecessary items are not brought to school and are kept for home time activities.

3) A little request from all the teachers about key rings on children's bags - these are getting out of hand with multiple key rings being attached to bags - this means they cannot fit inside the drawers and be stored easily - so please would you make sure there is no more than one per bag when we return on Monday.

Finally, I hope you all can have a wonderful weekend and we look forward to seeing you and all the children on Monday.

Did you know your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following?

- ♦ Income Support
- ♦ Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- ♦ Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- ♦ Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Frequently Asked Questions re Free School Meals

- In addition, the following pupils will be protected against losing their free school meals as follows:
- Pupils who were eligible on 1st April 2018 or who became eligible since then continue to receive free meals even if their household is no longer eligible under the benefits/low earnings criteria up until March 2025 and then until the end of their current phase of education. New Applicants for free school meals on or after 1st April 2018 who are in receipt of Universal Credit and have earnings above the earned income threshold (as noted above) will not be eligible for free school meals.
- ◆ Can an infant pupil be eligible for benefit-related free school meals even though they receive Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM)?
- Yes! Any pupil, who attends school for at least one full day a week and whose parents match the eligibility criteria, can receive benefits-related free school meals. An infant pupil who is eligible will then be protected (under transitional protection) and will continue to receive free school meals even when they are no longer eligible for UIFSM i.e. when they move to Year 3. They will also be entitled to vouchers to cover the holiday periods.
- Are nursery pupils eligible for benefits-related free school meals?
- If a pupil attends a maintained nursery (including academies), for at least one full day a week (before and after the lunch break) and their parents are in receipt of a qualifying benefit then the pupil is eligible for benefits-related free school meals.
- Do both parents have to eligible?
- As long as both parents have parental responsibility for the specific pupil, we can use either parent's information to help determine eligibility, giving the pupil the best chance to receive free school meal entitlement.




