

Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope you all had a lovely half term break. The children have returned to school well rested and ready for another busy few weeks ahead. KS1 have already begun learning the songs for their Christmas production – apologies if you're hearing a few festive renditions at home already!

In our assemblies this week, we continued exploring the inspiring work of **Jacqui Parkinson**. Together, we read the biblical story of **Jesus showing anger in the temple**, often referred to as *The Cleansing of the Temple*. We reflected on different emotions and discussed how even anger can sometimes be a positive force when it's a response to injustice or unfairness in the world. During their class assemblies, the children also shared thoughtful ideas about the ways they can make a difference in their own lives and communities.

This week, we were delighted to welcome lots of prospective parents into our school. As always, the children did us proud, and our visitors shared many positive comments – both about the warm, welcoming environment and the fantastic Year 6 pupils who showed them around our lovely school.

You should have received the **SIAMS report** this morning. We are incredibly proud of the feedback received and of everyone—children, staff, governors, and families—who play a part in making our school such a nurturing and inspiring place to learn.

The **Poppy Appeal** has been a great success this week, with all money raised going to the Royal British Legion. In assembly, we have been talking to the children about the significance of **Remembrance Sunday**, and we will observe a two-minute silence across the school at 11am on Tuesday.

A huge thank you to the **mini band** who performed during this morning's assembly. Their rehearsal in the practical room before school provided a wonderful musical welcome for our Year 1 children!

The school photographer visited this week to take individual and sibling photos. As there were many children to get through, he will be returning next Wednesday (12th) to complete the remaining photographs.

Establishing your own version of 'This is how we do it here' ensures that everyone knows the expectations and that our behaviour is governed by design rather than default. It can be useful to spend some time thinking about how your adults will behave; what values you will live by, what routines are important to you, and how you will deal with conflict.


