Headteacher's Letter

Dear Parents,

After the brief respite of last weekend, the weather has returned with a vengeance this week— and looks set to continue into the weekend! However, that hasn't stopped the school from powering through and wrapping up as many tasks as possible, ensuring we finish the year on a strong note and look forward to the summer holidays with excitement and optimism for the year ahead.

Our assembly theme this term has been "Incredible Journeys", and this week we explored Buddhism, including a story about wisdom being the light in our lives. We've been reflecting on the changes that lie ahead for all of us. It's perfectly normal to feel a little anxious about change, but we've reminded the children of how much they've already grown and adapted. For most pupils (sorry, Year 6!), the changes coming will be small—and we know they are more than ready for them.

I was fortunate to join Year 6 on their residential trip to **Marchants Hill** this week. Next week I'll also be sending out a survey on school uniform, so please keep an eye out for that!

As we celebrate the end of term, I can't help but look forward to tomorrow's **Village Show**—an event I've heard a great deal about since my appointment last year! The excitement has been building across the school, and it's clearly a cherished tradition in the community. I'm looking forward to experiencing it first-hand — taking in the festivities and enjoying the displays of our pupils' talents in singing, dancing, and art.

Finally, a quick update on **school uniform**: Following recent Department for Education recommendations, we've revised our uniform policy to ensure that there are **no more than three compulsory items of logo-branded clothing**.

From **September**, the requirements will be:

- **Key Stage 1**: A logo'd cardigan or jumper, and a logo'd PE shirt.
- **Key Stage 2**: A logo'd blazer, tie, and a logo'd PE polo shirt.

hard to present his numbers neatly. Well done Yousef!


