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Headteacher's Letter

Dear Parents

It has been lovely to see the sunshine this week — and what a busy week it's been! We began by learning in assembly about the Festival of Pentecost, reflecting on how important goodbyes are. We talked about how goodbyes can happen for many different reasons, but they are rarely forever — more often, it's "goodbye for now," as we know we'll see each other again.

This theme links nicely to the excitement of preparing for the new school year. Today marked the start of our transition process, with children meeting their new class teacher (and, for some, new classmates). We have a second transition morning planned for Monday and a third one later this term. We recognise that these changes can bring up a range of emotions for children, and it's vital that we acknowledge and support these feelings. Some children may not even realise that their emotions are connected to saying goodbye to their current teacher — or school — and moving on to something new.

We've put a great deal of thought into our transition process this year. We want to give children the opportunity to get to know their new teacher while there's still time to see them regularly around school. We also want staff to begin building relationships with their new classes. This approach helps to ease uncertainty (while recognising that feeling unsure is completely normal) and gives children the chance to ask questions and build confidence. A list of which teachers will be teaching each class is on the following page.

This is also the first year that we have mixed Reception and Year 2 groups, so we are especially mindful that these children may need extra positivity and encouragement as they leave some friends behind and prepare to make new ones.

As if that wasn't exciting enough, we also have our Father's Day event taking place this afternoon! Miss Adams and her team have worked incredibly hard to make sure that fathers, grandads, uncles and other significant adults enjoy a wonderful time on the field with the children in Reception, Year 1, and Year 2. The weather is looking promising too — we look forward to seeing many of you there.

I wanted to let you know that Mrs Austwick will be taking some time off from school due to being unwell. We are sending her all our support and look forward to her returning when she has recovered.

Finally, I'd like to share more sporting success! Our Year 5/6 District Sports team finished in second place on Wednesday, and our amazing girls' cricket team were the only team to defeat the eventual winners, Horsell, at this week's Kwik Cricket competition. We're incredibly proud of all the children who took part and represented the school so brilliantly.

I should also mention that Year 5 had a fantastic time visiting Fullbrook School on Monday, the Bug Workshop on Thursday was a roaring success, and Year 2 had "the best time ever" at The Look Out Centre.

All in all, it's been a very busy — and very brilliant — week!

Cricket Club. We were so proud of their superb team effort and saw some impressive batting, bowling and fielding




skills. Sadly we were just a few runs away from third place. They were pleased to be able to say, they had won their match against the overall winners earlier on in the competition.

Parent and carer support

Supporting children who face additional challenges can be difficult at times. With that in mind, the Hope Service has created a space for groups of parents and carers to come together on a regular basis to discuss the challenges they face in a confidential and supportive environment.

These groups are specifically for parents and carers of children who would like additional support. You will have an opportunity to exchange experiences and receive support towards managing the often complex situations you find yourselves in. This is not a parenting class, rather a non-judgemental support group and we encourage you to talk about whatever seems most important.

Support is offered via Microsoft Teams by Hope staff members, which could include a Therapist, Nurse, Teacher, Social Worker and Hope day programme staff or outside facilitators.
